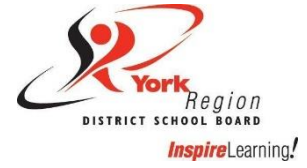

COVID-19 School Screening

Parents and guardians of Elementary students are required to complete the on-line self-assessment [Covid-19 School and Childcare Screening Tool](#) (please click on Check for Symptoms Daily) on a daily basis, prior to their child entering the school. LUNCHES

We ask that parents ensure that all students bring a **Litterless/Boomerang Lunch** with them to school every day by packing their snacks and lunch items in reusable food and water containers. Plastic cutlery is not supplied by the school so please remember to pack a spoon or fork in your child's lunch bag. Please ensure your child has their own water bottle which can be filled throughout the day at the refill station in the school. Students are to wash hands or use hand sanitizer before and after eating. Students are to be reminded not to share food, utensils or drinks. For safety reasons, lunch drop offs will not be permitted. All special lunch programs/food days (e.g., pizza, sub, etc.) are cancelled until further notice. All food delivery services (UberEats/Skip the Dishes) will not be accepted.

Attendance and Safe Arrival Program

It is the policy of the York Region District School Board for all elementary schools to monitor and report on the safe arrival of our students. If you know that your child will be absent, please enter your child's absence in Edsby or call (905) 727-2022 and press 2 to leave a message on the school's attendance line. If we do not know why your child is absent, we will, under Policy #665.0, do the following:

1. Call the home and business numbers provided.
2. Call the emergency contact number(s) provided.
3. If the above are unsuccessful, we will call the York Regional Police to report your child as missing.

Your support in following the procedure outlined above is important in ensuring the safe arrival of all of our students.
