Prom is approaching quickly, and the staff of Dr. G. W. Williams Secondary School is pleased to celebrate this occasion with grade 12 students on Thursday, June 8, 2023 at the Manor Event Venue at 16750 Weston Road, King. The evening will begin at 6:00 PM and end at 10:30 PM. Doors close promptly at 6:30 PM. The evening's events will include dinner at 7:00 PM followed by dancing. Prom will be supervised by school board staff and the York Regional Police.

In order to attend, students must complete and return all necessary forms provided to them, and attend the grade 12 assembly. Proof of ticket purchase is required.

Tickets will be available for purchase through School Cash Online, from Monday, March 27th -Wednesday, April 5th (ticket sales may close early if max is reached).

Please Note:

- > Due to venue size, only 300 tickets will be sold to this event. Don't delay in purchasing your ticket. If finances are a barrier, please see your alpha VP so they can assist PRIOR to sales closing. We want to ensure everyone has an opportunity to attend that would like to (within the capacity of the venue).
- > Upon initial release, only one ticket per student may be purchased.
- ➤ Priority is offered to students currently attending Dr. G.W. Williams.
- Individual ticket price is dependent on whether or not the student activity fee has previously been paid. All ticket sales will be reviewed to ensure the correct payment amount has been demonstrated.
- ➤ If unable to attend prom, no refunds will be issued.
- > If space remains at the end of the initial selling period, the opportunity to purchase guest tickets will begin on Monday, April 17th and end on Thursday, April 20th on a first come first served basis. Further information around guest ticket sales will be available after April 5th.

YRDSB and Community Notices

Passover (Judaism)

Pesaḥ (Passover) commemorates the departure of Israelites from slavery in Egypt. The festival of Passover is celebrated for eight days, the first two and last two days are observed as holy days. The evenings of the first and second days of Pesaḥ begin with Seder meals (festive meals and the telling of the Passover story). The final day of Pesaḥ marks the Israelites' crossing of the Reed Sea, as related in The Book of Exodus

Easter

Easter is celebrated by Christians as a holiday. It represents the fulfillment of the prophecies of the Old Testament and the revelation of God's salvific plan for all of humankind. The Bible says that Jesus Christ died on a cross on a day called Good Friday. He was resurrected and came back to life on Easter Sunday.

Ramadan (Islam)

Ramadan, began on Mar 22 evening, is a holy month of fasting and contemplation for Muslims. Ramadan, the ninth month of the Islamic calendar, is referred to in the Qu'ran as a blessed month in which the teachings of the Qu'ran were revealed to the Prophet Muhammad (pbuh). During Ramadan, most Muslims fast during the hours of daylight and increase their focus on prayer and contemplation. At the end of each day the fast is traditionally ended with a prayer and a light meal called the iftar. Ramadan is considered a time for Muslims to recommit themselves to cultivating spiritual renewal within themselves and their communities, as well as practicing compassion and generosity for others. Schools acknowledge this time through activities that promote understanding and learning for all students, while being respectful and making space for learners that are fasting or observing Ramadan. During this time of reverence and renewal, we extend our good wishes to staff, students, parents and members of the Muslim communities who will be observing Ramadan.

Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT), Spring 2023

The spring administration of the OSSLT is scheduled to occur between March 1 - April 26, 2023. The test is online and will be open to eligible students who did not participate or were not successful in the fall administration. The majority of our students wrote the test in the fall so that students would have a second opportunity to achieve their literacy graduation requirement as early as possible, with only the second result considered.

- Full Disclosure is May 8, 2023 Semester 2 courses dropped by this date will not show on a student's official transcript.
- Course Selections for the upcoming school year are now closed. Please have students see their alpha guidance counsellor if they have any questions or concerns.
- Please note that Summer School Registrations will open in late spring. Students must enrol officially through their pathway planner even though they've expressed interest in their course selections.

Attendance Procedures

Extended Absences

Planned absences of three or more consecutive school days require the completion of an "Extraordinary Absence" form at least one week in advance of the

<u>leave</u>. The form is available in the Attendance Office. The process includes obtaining signatures from teachers and a school administrator. It is the student's responsibility to catch up on all work missed.

Parents/guardians should contact the Attendance Office to indicate when their child will be absent. The Attendance Office can be reached at 905-727-3131 ext. 100. If the attendance secretary is busy please leave a voice message OR send an email to drgwwilliamsss.attendance@yrdsb.ca. If a student leaves school resulting in a late or an absence to a class period, they are to go to the attendance office to sign out. If a student arrives late for Period 1 and before 8:45 a.m., they are asked to report directly to their class where their homeroom teacher will let the office know the time of arrival. If the 8:20 bell has rung, students are asked to stand in the hallway for the anthem and announcements to be completed before proceeding to their period 1 class. For any other period, whenever a student arrives at school after the first scheduled class period has begun they are to report to attendance to sign in.

Students are expected to be in class by the times listed above.

Students, parents, and staff have a role to play in ensuring that students attend classes regularly and punctually. Students are responsible for:

- attending all scheduled classes, and being on time;
- being prepared for classes, and participating fully in the planned learning activities;
- reporting absences (preferably in advance), and presenting proper documentation to staff, and covering the material missed when they are absent.

Absences must be both valid and authorized by a parent. Examples of valid reasons include illness, bereavement, medical appointments, court appearance, etc. If no phone call, e-mail, or note is received by the school, the absence will be considered "truant". Truancies are unacceptable.

Students who have been signed out of classes by a parent/legal guardian cannot remain on school property.

Parent(s)/guardian(s) and students aged 18 and older and students who have declared their independence must report all absences, late arrivals and/or changes to departure plans to the school in a timely manner. Where possible, notify the school in advance by calling the school and leaving a message on the answering machine or emailing the school's attendance address.

If a student is unable to attend school and will miss more than two school days, homework may be requested from the Guidance Department and picked up at the school. Teachers require 24 hours to complete homework requests. If a student is absent due to a prolonged illness, he/she may be required to provide a medical note.





Driveway and Parking Lot

At the end of the school day, the front driveway loop is closed to regular traffic from about 2:50 to 3:10 pm. Only school taxis and buses are to use the front driveway loop at the end of the day in order to create a safe place for our students with special needs. Once all the school taxis and buses leave the front driveway loop around 3:10, regular traffic may use this area. To support our efforts to ensure physical distance, we ask that you make arrangements to meet your students at the nearest exit from their classroom (in one of the parking lots) or off school property (down the street, around the corner, etc.). Please see the maps below to support your efforts.



There is one-way traffic in our front driveway loop. In the front driveway loop, drop off/pick up students on the right side; drive through only on the left side. For safety reasons, do not drop off/pick up students on the left side.



If you MUST come to the school, enter via the West lot (beside the track, closest to Yonge Street) and drive around the school to meet your child. DO NOT block the driveway waiting. There is one-way traffic in the west entrance and on the south (back) side of the school. It is two-way traffic on the east side of the school, however, during the end of the day pick-up time you will notice the admin directing all vehicles to enter the west lot ONLY so that we have a constant flow out of the east lot. This makes a significant positive impact on safety for all and makes it easier and less stressful for everyone. When you are able to enter the east lot, do not make U-turns anywhere in the east parking lot from Dunning Avenue to the south parking lot. Making a U-turn in this area creates an unsafe condition for pedestrians and other vehicles. If you need to turn around, please pull into a parking spot and carefully back out.



Please note that Dunning Avenue is a **no stopping zone**. This is noted by the signage along the street and on the map above you can see the red arrows on both sides of the street.
