Message from the Principal

Over the last week the admin team (myself, Ms. Mitchell and Mr. Gazaneo) visited every classroom to review safe schools procedures. We discussed our commitment to addressing any incidents of discrimination or racism within our school and encouraged all students and staff to support our caring and safe school environment by speaking up regarding any concerns. Students are asked to speak to any caring adult in the building or submit non-urgent concerns via ReportIt on our website (we reminded students that anonymous reports often are difficult to resolve and we also want the opportunity to follow-up with any student sharing concerns to let them know their concerns have been addressed). We also reminded students about appropriate bathroom use (no loitering, use only for intended purpose-toilet and urinal use and washing hands) and laws regarding smoking and vaping within 20m of school property. Finally we spoke about locker use and the importance of ensuring lockers are locked, combinations are not shared and that items found within lockers are the responsibility of the student registered for that locker.

Thank you to all of our students and the hard work of our Guidance department we have completed the course selection process for the 2023-2024 school year. Over the next few months we will be working through course selections and staffing to provide a timetable for students. As a reminder, we are working with a new student management system this year and therefore we expect the process to take a little longer than usual. Please be patient with the Guidance and Admin teams as we work through this process in an effort to create a result that supports students positively. Course offerings are based on student enrollment and the Guidance team will begin communicating with any students that have selected courses that are under-enrolled shortly to ensure that final course selections are accurate before we fully begin the timetabling process. This will allow all students' needs to be considered equally when building the timetable.

As we head into the March Break, please ensure that everyone has the opportunity to step away from school for a change of pace and much needed rest and relaxation before we head into the final quarter of the year. Interim report cards will be sent home electronically the week after the break and Teacher Interviews will be held on March 30th. More information will be shared soon regarding booking of interviews.

The majority of our students wrote the test in the fall so that students would have a second opportunity to achieve their literacy graduation requirement as early as possible, with only the second result considered.

Attendance Procedures

Extended Absences

<u>Planned absences of three or more consecutive school days require the completion of an "Extraordinary Absence" form at least one week in advance of the leave</u>. The form is available in the Attendance Office. The process includes obtaining signatures from teachers and a school administrator. It is the student's responsibility to catch up on all work missed.

Parents/guardians should contact the Attendance Office to indicate when their child will be absent. The Attendance Office can be reached at 905-727-3131 ext. 100. If the attendance secretary is busy please leave a voice message OR send an email to <u>drgwwilliamsss.attendance@yrdsb.ca</u>. If a student leaves school resulting in a late or an absence to a class period, they are to go to the attendance office to sign out. If a student arrives late for Period 1 and before 8:45 a.m., they are asked to report directly to their class where their homeroom teacher will let the office know the time of arrival. If the 8:20 bell has rung, students are asked to stand in the hallway for the anthem and announcements to be completed before proceeding to their period 1 class. For any other period, whenever a student arrives at school after the first scheduled class period has begun they are to report to attendance to sign in.

Students are expected to be in class by the times listed above.

Students, parents, and staff have a role to play in ensuring that students attend classes regularly and punctually. Students are responsible for:

- attending all scheduled classes, and being on time;
- being prepared for classes, and participating fully in the planned learning activities;
- reporting absences (preferably in advance), and presenting proper documentation to staff, and covering the material missed when they are absent.

Absences must be both valid and authorized by a parent. Examples of valid reasons include illness, bereavement, medical appointments, court appearance, etc. If no phone call, e-mail, or note is received by the school, the absence will be considered "truant". Truancies are unacceptable.

Students who have been signed out of classes by a parent/legal guardian cannot remain on school property.

Parent(s)/guardian(s) and students aged 18 and older and students who have declared their independence must report all absences, late arrivals and/or changes to departure plans to the school in a timely manner. Where possible, notify the school in advance by calling the school and leaving a message on the answering machine or emailing the school's attendance address.

If a student is unable to attend school and will miss more than two school days, homework may be requested from the Guidance Department and picked up at the school. Teachers require 24 hours to complete homework requests. If a student is absent due to a prolonged illness, he/she may be required to provide a medical note.

Driveway and Parking Lot

At the end of the school day, the front driveway loop is closed to regular traffic from about 2:50 to 3:10 pm. Only school taxis and buses are to use the front driveway loop at the end of the day in order to create a safe place for our students with special needs. Once all the school taxis and buses leave the front driveway loop around 3:10, regular traffic may use this area. To support our efforts to ensure physical distance, we ask that you make arrangements to meet your students at the nearest exit from their classroom (in one of the parking lots) or off school property (down the street, around the corner, etc.). Please see the maps below to support your efforts.



There is one-way traffic in our front driveway loop. In the front driveway loop, drop off/pick up students on the right side; drive through only on the left side. For safety reasons, do not drop off/pick up students on the left side.



If you MUST come to the school, enter via the West lot (beside the track, closest to Yonge Street) and drive around the school to meet your child. DO NOT block the driveway waiting. There is one-way traffic in the west entrance and on the south (back) side of the school. It is two-way traffic on the east side of the school, however, during the end of the day pick-up time you will notice the admin directing all vehicles to enter the west lot ONLY so that we have a constant flow out of the east lot. This makes a significant positive impact on safety for all and makes it easier and less stressful for everyone. When you are able to enter the east lot, do not make U-turns anywhere in the east parking lot from Dunning Avenue to the south parking lot. Making a U-turn in this area creates an unsafe condition for pedestrians and other vehicles. If you need to turn around, please pull into a parking spot and carefully back out.



Please note that Dunning Avenue is a **no stopping zone**. This is noted by the signage along the street and on the map above you can see the red arrows on both sides of the street.
