# Message from the Principal

As semester one draws to a close we are looking ahead to the first set of final exams in 3 years. For our Grade 12 students, these are the first exams they have written since Semester 1 of their Grade 9 year. For the rest of our students, this is the first set of exams they have ever written. As a staff we are very aware of the significance of this for students and the preparation necessary to support students in every grade to confidently completed final course requirements in all subject areas. Teachers have spent a great deal of time reflecting on assessment practices and considering a variety of ways to provide students with opportunities to demonstrate their learning. Students and staff have been extremely busy since we returned from the winter break fulfilling the requirements of the 30% culminating work to demonstrate and evaluate academic achievement (our exams are one element of this in <u>some</u> courses). Please reach out to your child's subject teacher <u>PRIOR</u> to the end of the semester if you have concerns. Teachers will also be reaching out to parents if they have concerns about credit attainment so that there are no surprises when report cards are issued.

All students received their confirmed courses for Semester 2 at the beginning of the school year. Many have already connected with Guidance if changes were needed. We continue to complete staffing for the upcoming semester and refining room assignments. Students will receive an emailed timetable prior to the start of semester 2 once all details have been updated and finalized. Given ongoing issues with communication between TeachAssist and our new Student Management System students should rely on the email received from the school for accurate timetable information.

Course selection assemblies were held the first week back in January in preparation for this process to occur in February. More information will follow on timelines and students will be notified when My Pathway Planner has been fully updated to represent all options for the coming year. We encourage students to use the next few weeks to research their options, ask questions and then 'choose once and choose wisely' as staffing decisions are made based on student course selections and timetable changes are limited after the fact.

We wish all our students success as they navigate through this upcoming exam period. Melissa Schmidt

# **\*IMPORTANT UPDATES\***

- **Course Selections** open on February 16 and are due by February 24th.
  - Using the pathway planner on myBlueprint, students can:
    - Indicate they are not returning to GWW for the next school year.
    - Opt out of the e-learning requirement (if students are in grade 9 or 10).
    - Express interest in taking a summer school course this year. Please note this is not registration that will happen later this spring. If a student intends to take summer school, <u>do not</u> select that course for next year.
- Night school registrations are open for Semester 2 please sign up on myBlueprint > Continuing Education > Explore Courses > Submit a course and remember to print off the permission form and submit it to your guidance counsellor.
- Graduates of 2023 must complete and submit their volunteer hours by Tuesday, May 23rd, 2023.

## Attendance Procedures

# Extended Absences

Planned absences of three or more consecutive school days require the completion of an "Extraordinary Absence" form at least one week in advance of the leave. The form is available in the Attendance Office. The process includes obtaining signatures from teachers and a school administrator. It is the student's responsibility to catch up on all work missed.

Parents/guardians should contact the Attendance Office to indicate when their child will be absent. The Attendance Office can be reached at 905-727-3131 ext. 100. If the attendance secretary is busy please leave a voice message OR send an email to <u>drgwwilliamsss.attendance@yrdsb.ca</u>. If a student leaves school resulting in a late or an absence to a class period, they are to go to the attendance office to sign out. If a student arrives late for Period 1 and before 8:45 a.m., they are asked to report directly to their class where their homeroom teacher will let the office know the time of arrival. If the 8:20 bell has rung, students are asked to stand in the hallway for the anthem and announcements to be completed before proceeding to their period 1 class. For any other period, whenever a student arrives at school after the first scheduled class period has begun they are to report to attendance to sign in.

Students are expected to be in class by the times listed above.

Students, parents, and staff have a role to play in ensuring that students attend classes regularly and punctually. Students are responsible for:

- attending all scheduled classes, and being on time;
- being prepared for classes, and participating fully in the planned learning activities;
- reporting absences (preferably in advance), and presenting proper documentation to staff, and covering the material missed when they are absent.

Absences must be both valid and authorized by a parent. Examples of valid reasons include illness, bereavement, medical appointments, court appearance, etc. If no phone call, e-mail, or note is received by the school, the absence will be considered "truant". Truancies are unacceptable.

Students who have been signed out of classes by a parent/legal guardian cannot remain on school property.

Parent(s)/guardian(s) and students aged 18 and older and students who have declared their independence must report all absences, late arrivals and/or changes to departure plans to the school in a timely manner. Where possible, notify the school in advance by calling the school and leaving a message on the answering machine or emailing the school's attendance address.

If a student is unable to attend school and will miss more than two school days, homework may be requested from the Guidance Department and picked up at the school. Teachers require 24 hours to complete homework requests. If a student is absent due to a prolonged illness, he/she may be required to provide a medical note.


## **Safety and Community Notices**

York Regional Transit (YRT) has announced a new Route 32 northbound trip, beginning September 14, to meet the afternoon bell time at Dr. G. W. Williams. This information won't be reflected on their website until November 6 but is included in this <u>flyer</u>.


We continue to work with YRT to provide an improved experience for our students riding the 426 buses at the end of each day. Please remind your students to line up single file to board the buses and to stay behind the sidewalk (on the field) until the buses arrive and begin loading. This is important for everyone's safety.

## **Driveway and Parking Lot**

At the end of the school day, the front driveway loop is closed to regular traffic from about 2:50 to 3:10 pm. Only school taxis and buses are to use the front driveway loop at the end of the day in order to create a safe place for our students with special needs. Once all the school taxis and buses leave the front driveway loop around 3:10, regular traffic may use this area. To support our efforts to ensure physical distance, we ask that you make arrangements to meet your students at the nearest exit from their classroom (in one of the parking lots) or off school property (down the street, around the corner, etc.). Please see the maps below to support your efforts.



There is one-way traffic in our front driveway loop. In the front driveway loop, drop off/pick up students on the right side; drive through only on the left side. For safety reasons, do not drop off/pick up students on the left side.



If you MUST come to the school, enter via the West lot (beside the track, closest to Yonge Street) and drive around the school to meet your child. DO NOT block the driveway waiting. There is one-way traffic in the west entrance and on the south (back) side of the school. It is two-way traffic on the east side of the school, however, during the end of the day pick-up time you will notice the admin directing all vehicles to enter the west lot ONLY so that we have a constant flow out of the east lot. This makes a significant positive impact on safety for all and makes it easier and less stressful for everyone. When you are able to enter the east lot, do not make U-turns anywhere in the east parking lot from Dunning Avenue to the south parking lot. Making a U-turn in this area creates an unsafe condition for pedestrians and other vehicles. If you need to turn around, please pull into a parking spot and carefully back out.



Please note that Dunning Avenue is a **no stopping zone**. This is noted by the signage along the street and on the map above you can see the red arrows on both sides of the street.
