



IB Programme Fees

\$3,090 Total

- \$257.50 in Grade 9
 - the grade 9 fee is payable at time of acceptance of offer of admission
- \$360.50 in Grade 10 (paid in March of Grade 9 year)
- \$1,236 per year in both Grade 11 and Grade 12
 (paid by installment in March, April and May of Grade 10 & 11 years)
- These fees cannot be used as tax deductions












School Locator


- The School Locator application only recognizes Region of York addresses for school attendance.

School Year on School Locator





Step 2: Portfolio

- The Personal Portfolio is an opportunity for students to tell us about themselves
- Students are asked to think about the life experiences that they have had and to choose three (3) artifacts that represent how these life experiences have shaped them as individuals
- For each artifact students should, in 75 words or less:
 - explain what they have learned about themselves from the experience and explain how they can apply this learning in the future





Portfolio Details

For the purpose of this task, an artifact is a visual or graphic representation of an experience.

Examples of experiences may include:

- a life event
- a community event
- an initiative you have demonstrated
- a personal accomplishment
- participation in an activity
- involvement in the creation of something
- the practice of a tradition
- a responsibility you have taken





Personal Portfolio: Purpose

- The portfolio provides an opportunity for applicants to share something about themselves
- When you are deciding what to include, select experiences/artifacts that are meaningful to YOU
- This is a PERSONAL Portfolio
 - We are hoping to learn about the <u>applicant</u>
 - To help us do this we expect students to work independently, and honestly





Personal Portfolio Next Steps

- For now, students can think about what experiences they would like to include, and how they might want to represent them as artifacts
- Information about submitting the Portfolio will be sent to the student's email address after 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, November 7, 2023
 - For YRDSB students this address will be their YRDSB gapps account
 - For students who are not currently in the YRDSB system, the email will be sent to the student email address entered on the EDSBY application form



Formatting and Submitting the Portfolio

- In the email you will receive:
 - a reminder of the instructions for completing the Portfolio
 - a template for formatting the Portfolio as a Google
 Slide presentation
 - instructions about how to submit your finished
 Portfolio through a Google Form

The submission due date is:

9:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 14, 2023



Portfolio Tips

- We encourage students to consider the guiding prompt and consider their responses carefully
- Remember to review the template for tips on how to format each slide
- Once it is submitted, students will not be able to edit the content

The Assessment Task


- During the assessment task, the teacher will share a prompt (e.g. a picture or a quotation)
- Students will have 40 minutes to plan, write and edit their response to the prompt
- The student response should be written in full sentences and organized in paragraph form
- Student responses will be assessed for both the ideas and the clear communication of those ideas
