#### Objective

-Learn from global health leaders who are working on big ideas in global health. -Learn why diversity, equality, equity, diversity, and justice matter in global health. -Work in small groups to research and develop ideas to solve a global health problem.

### Why this Matters

Global health issues represent a local, national, and international challenge. The <u>Global Health Education</u> <u>Initiative</u> at the University of Toronto said this about global health: "Global health is a conceptual framework to understand how expressions of health and illness are impacted by underlying determinants to affect world populations. In Toronto, the most multicultural city in the world, global health is local health and local health is global health. Global Health knowledge and skills are useful in everyday practice in Canada and are critical to solving the most challenging health problems affecting individuals and communities around the globe". If understanding this challenge matters to you, then SummerUp's Global Health Mini-Masters program is for you.

In SummerUp's Global Health Mini-Masters program, students will explore global health critical issues, hear from leaders who are working on big ideas in global health, and learn how they can become advocates for change. Additionally, students will:

- Develop research skills and learn to analyze data.
- Gain understanding of critical health challenges facing our world's people.
- Explore ways in which they may contribute to making our world better, and may adopt a global perspective and become advocates for change.
- Work in small groups to research and develop ideas to solve a global health problem.
- Learn why equality, equity, diversity and justice matter in global health.
- Gain insights into health-based career opportunities.

This Global Health Mini-Masters program will offer students a chance to work collaboratively and build peer relationships.

Who: You are a Black youth, Ontario resident, and are enrolled in Grades 8 to 12 during the academic year 2020-21. You are keen to advance your knowledge in medical science and to do so with other like-minded students. You have the required equipment to learn online. You are willing to commit to attending all scheduled learning sessions (see dates and times below).

Start/Stop Dates: SummerUp will offer two sections of the *Global Health Mini-Masters* Section 1: Starts Monday, July 12 and ends Friday, July 16, 2021. This section is of one-week duration. Classes run Monday to Friday and each session begins at 9.00 a.m. and ends at 1.00 p.m. Breaks will be included. Section 2: Starts Monday, August 9 and ends Friday, August 13, 2021. This section is of one-week duration. Classes run Monday to Friday and each session begins at 9.00 a.m. and ends at 1.00 p.m. Breaks will be included.

Meeting Pattern: Each section will meet five consecutive days (Monday to Friday) and classes will begin at 9.00 a.m. and end at 1.00 p.m., breaks included.

Mode: Online. Students must have a suitable computer device and internet access.

Admission: To be considered for admission, candidates must attend a program orientation at 6.30 p.m., Tuesday, June 29, 2021. This orientation will be co-hosted by the Leadership by Design program and University of Toronto Schools.
