It is important that as individuals we reflect on the emotions that the murder of George Floyd and the ensuing riots and protests have brought forward in us and members of our school community who are deeply affected by this violence. As a school, we have worked hard within our community to build a safe and inclusive space for all community members. We know that despite our best intentions, incidents like this highlight the real safety concerns that some members of our school community face. We need to support all members of our community to share their concerns and help us to continue to build upon successes and address any shortcomings in our work. We can't change what happened, we can commit our actions to do better. I am pleased to see this week that our student's @artsgww are expressing their feelings through their art work and sharing their thoughts and opening up the conversations that matter. In the words of Martin Luther King, "Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter." Those words couldn't be more true at this time. Now is not the time to be silent but to speak up and do what is right.

Grade 8 Reach Ahead 2020 Summer Credit – Language Program & Grade 9 to 12 Students (Spanish & Mandarin)

- Grade 8 students can now take a Grade 9 credit course this summer in Spanish or Mandarin.
