Message from the Principal

It is nice to finally have some sunnier weather to help us cope with being at home so much of the time. We hope that this edition of the Williams' Tell finds each of your families managing as best as we can. As disappointed as we were to hear earlier in the week that we wouldn't be returning to the school for the remainder of this year, we know that it is in the best interest of everyone's safety.

Last week we took the opportunity to check in with our students regarding their experience working from home through a short survey sent to their GAPPS account. Over 200 students took the opportunity to respond providing us with feedback to incorporate into teacher planning.

Based on the feedback we received from students, we felt it was important to review the expectations of our current learn at home protocol. A full-time student taking 4 courses (the majority of our Grade 9, 10 and 11 students) should have about 35 minutes\course\day (3 hours\week). This works out to about 2.5 hours of work for all of their classes each day.

Of the students who responded to our survey, 44% indicated that they are working on average 4+ hours per day on course work. Additionally, 13.5% of students indicated that their workload was overwhelming. As a staff we are concerned about the amount of time that students are spending on the work that is planned as well as the students who are feeling overwhelmed. When we shared this data with the entire staff this week we agreed that staff members would reach out to each of their classes to gather specific feedback related to how their planning is supporting students so that they can make adjustments to benefit student well-being.

The last question we asked students was whether they would appreciate assistance with managing their workload. 21.5% of respondents indicated that they would appreciate assistance. As of last Friday, we assigned every student who requested assistance a teacher or CYW contact person who was reaching out to those students through their GAPPS accounts to arrange appointments to better understand their learning needs and to support them by connecting with their teachers.

We want to remind all students and families that there are no exams at the end of this semester. Students should be taking this time to engage in learning in its truest sense. The final grade at the end of this semester will not be any lower than the grade students were earning on March 13. For students who did not feel that what they were earning as of March 13 is reflective of their overall ability, now is an excellent time to consistently demonstrate their academic ability and work with teachers to improve their evaluation before reports are issued at the end of June. Given the cancellation of final exams, students will be completing course work right up to June 25th which gives all students ample opportunity to finish curriculum content to prepare for next year's instruction as well as demonstrate their full academic ability.

As we continue to learn ourselves about various means for using technology and ways that students benefit from various technology approaches the staff our evolving their approaches to teaching and learning in this new environment. We encourage students to dialogue with their teachers to support this growth for all.

We know that for our Grade 12s this is a very disappointing time due to the cancellation and postponement of some major milestone events. We continue to discuss how to effectively recognize the achievements of these students in a meaningful way. At this time we are brainstorming ideas related to our grads so that when we receive direction from YRDSB on next steps we will be ready to take action in our school community.

As we look to year end events such as the athletic banquet and music banquet (as examples) we are looking for ways to acknowledge achievements electronically. We will be relying on permissions granted through the Student Consent forms submitted in September to allow us to use photos in these celebrations virtually. We will be reaching out to families who have not submitted this paperwork so that we are able to include all students where applicable. If your circumstances have changed since September and\or you have concerns about us using photos taken throughout the year to acknowledge your child in a virtual presentation please let us know right away.

Thank you for your ongoing support of your students and our teachers as we all work through learning at home. Please don't hesitate to connect with classroom teachers if you have any feedback to support your child's learning.
