2021-2022 Secondary Model - as sent to all families by YRDSB on June 17th

Secondary schools are continuing to timetable for the 2021-2022 school year, keeping in mind requirements from the Ministry of Education and public health protocols. Our Board will continue to use the modified four course semester model (i.e., a rotation of two courses per day on a weekly basis). FALL 2021 Dual Credit is Now Open!

This year, due to the current situation, we have been able to confirm that almost all of the dual credits will be delivered on-line. We have 2 lab-based courses that we may be able to offer face to face if public health and school board protocols permit in September. We will open the registration for the winter and spring dual credit offerings later in semester 1 once we have further details.

How to register your students:

- 1. Ensure that the student meets the dual credit eligibility criteria: The primary focus group for dual credit courses is for senior YRDSB students who:
 - face significant challenges in completing the requirements for graduation
 - Are credit deficient
 - Have left school before graduating
 - NEW: There are a few course offerings that are specific for certain SHSM sectors (ICT and JCT). The dual credit for those students can be counted towards their SHSM major courses.
- 2. Priority will be given to grade 12 students, other applicants will be considered but placed on a waiting list including grade 11 students.
- 3. Students will complete an online application with their GAPPS account using the following link: www.bit.ly\YRDSBdualcreditapp
- 4. Once the student has been approved, they will receive a copy of the their completed application in their GAPPS email
- 5. Signed and completed dual credit applications should be sent electronically to the regional dual credit teacher.

At this time, please contact the students who have chosen the Dual Credit program through My Pathway Planner (they will have a YYY4X holding code in their course requests) to encourage them to register for their particular course of interest if they are scheduled for Semester 1 only.

Please encourage interested students to register as soon as possible as seats for each of the courses are limited.

Attention Retiring Students:

The purpose of this memorandum is to ensure that all retiring students from York Region District School Board - whether they are graduating or moving school boards - have the opportunity to download their Google Workspace for Education files as found in their Google Drive. The updated Student Retirement Form includes a Google Takeout checkbox and hyperlink to additional instructions. Due to the size of some Drives and the potential time to create the zip file, it is recommended that steps, as outlined below, not be done on a public/school computer.

Visit Google Takeout and login with your YRDSB Google Account.

1. Select the Google Apps and Services you want to export your data and documents from, and select the option to receive the file as a download via email (depending on the size of your Google account, this could take several hours). Use the .zip file option.

2. Once the Google Takeout email arrives, use the links to download your archived data and documents to the personal computer, USB/external drive and/or the personal Google Drive that you wish.

3. You can "unzip" the archives and then upload the data and documents to a new personal Google Account or use the files and documents in Microsoft Office or other applications.

Drop-In Virtual Support for Students

There are virtual drop-in sessions available every morning, from 8:30 am - 11:00 am, in order to provide a go-to place for students to ask general questions and get extra support while learning from home during their asynchronous days. The sessions will be supported daily by a (SERT) Special Education Resource Teacher. Students should check the Guidance Google classroom to access the link for the drop-in sessions.

Student Attendance

Thank you to everyone for supporting us with our efforts to increase the tracking of student attendance. To ensure we can continue to support student engagement and well-being we require accurate attendance records. **Parents\guardians are required to justify every student absence with a reason.**

Students currently attending the adaptive model must contact via email (drgwwilliamsss.attendance@yrdsb.ca) or phone call (905-727-3131, ext. 1) prior to 9 am in the morning regarding a student absence.

For any student over 18, they are responsible for reporting their own absences unless they have completed a Consent Information Sharing For Students at the Age of Majority form.

Report It

Our schools should be safe, welcoming and inclusive places for everyone. It is important that students know what to do if they witness or experience inappropriate behaviour or incidents of hate or discrimination.

- There may be situations when you can safely step in and intervene and help.
- Talk to an adult at school, family member or other trusted adult.
- Report the event without the person involved knowing using our online reporting tool, Report It.

Report It lets you share information about inappropriate student behaviour or incidents of hate or discrimination. You can use the online form to report:

- bullying, drugs, cheating, vandalism, harassment, violence or any other inappropriate behaviour
- incidents of discrimination or hate, including anti-Indigenous racism, ableism, anti-Asian racism, anti-Black racism, antisemitism, classism, homophobia, Islamophobia or other forms of hate

You can report events that happen at school, at school-related events, online or off school property if it negatively affects a student or the school climate. You can also choose to make a report anonymously.

Complete reports are shared with the school to investigate and respond.

Acts of discrimination, hate and bullying are never acceptable. Using the Report It tool is a way of standing up for each other and for ourselves. Driveway and Parking Lot

The safety of all students must be everyone's first priority. Please follow the procedures below.

At the end of the school day, the front driveway loop is closed to regular traffic from about 10:40 to 11:00. Only school taxis and buses are to use the front driveway loop at the end of the day in order to create a safe place for our students with special needs. Once all the school taxis and buses leave the front driveway loop around 11:00, regular traffic may use this area. To support our efforts to ensure physical distancing, we ask that you make arrangements to meet your students at the nearest exit from their classroom (in one of the parking lots) or off school property (down the street, around the corner, etc.). Please see the maps below to support your efforts.



There is one-way traffic in our front driveway loop. In the front driveway loop, drop off/pick up students on the right side; drive through only on the left side. For safety reasons, do not drop off/pick up students on the left side.



There is one-way traffic in the west entrance and on the south (back) side of the school. It is two-way traffic on the east side of the school, however, during the end of morning pick-up time you will have noticed the admin directing all vehicles to enter the west lot ONLY so that we have a constant flow out of the east lot. This adjustment has made a significant positive impact on safety for all and makes it easier and less stressful for everyone. When you are able to enter the east lot, do not make U-turns anywhere in the east parking lot from Dunning Avenue to the south parking lot. Making a U-turn in this area creates an unsafe condition for pedestrians and other vehicles. If you need to turn around, please pull into a parking spot and carefully back out.



Please note that Dunning Avenue is a **no stopping zone**. This is noted by the signage along the street and on the map above you can see the red arrows on both sides of the street. Our School Council previously worked with local by-law officials to identify areas within the neighbourhood that parents can pick up their students. Please note the arrows in green and red to support the effective flow of traffic in the area.
