## **COVID Self-Screening**

Secondary students will have to provide confirmation of a successful screening as follows:

- 1. After reading and answering the questions in the <u>York Region Public Health screening tool</u>, secondary students (or parents/guardians of students who may not be able to complete the form independently) must complete the <u>Secondary School Confirmation Form</u>. Upon completion of the form confirming successful screening, students will receive an email in their GAPPS email. For students who may not be able to complete the self-assessment process independently, parents/guardians are asked to complete it.
- 2. After receiving this email, students can then attend their school and will have to show the email response in one of the following ways to school staff:
  - Show email on phone (showing the email or a photo of the email)
  - Hard copy printout of the email
  - If neither option is available, students can provide verbal response confirming completion.

### Google Classroom\TeachAssist

As partner's in your child's education, we encourage parents and guardians to review the Google Classroom and TeachAssist materials with their child periodically to understand the work that is being completed in the classroom and your child's progress. Parents cannot be provided with their own login to either of these platforms but each student has a login. This is a great opportunity for dialogue with your child and to show your interest in their success. If you have any questions about your child's progress or material in the course, reach out to the classroom teacher.

### **Cafeteria**

- No food service available in the cafeteria those remaining in the school to eat during the lunch break will be required to bring their own food for lunch.
- Cafeteria is divided into quadrants by grade to support easy contact tracing. There is also an expectation that students need to be mindful each day where and with whom they eat lunch.
  - Orange Gr 9 first 2 rows + round tables by stage
  - Blue Gr. 10 second 2 rows
  - Pink Gr. 11 third 2 rows
  - Green Gr. 12 last row + wall
- There will be a maximum number per table (Large tables-6, Round tables-4) posted on each table to avoid overcrowding.
  - When all seats are full, the supervising teacher will put up a sign: "Capacity Reached" at the entrance of the cafeteria.
  - If additional students are waiting to use the lunchroom once capacity has been reached a time limit of 20 minutes will be implemented to support access for all students.
- The library is also open during lunch this year and students may eat their lunch in there.

### **Town of Aurora No Idling**


Did you know that the Town of Aurora is now idle-free? The Town of Aurora anti-idling policy states that as a motorist you MUST turn off your vehicle after 5 consecutive minutes of idling, unless in traffic. You can do other things to support the environment in the community by turning off your vehicle anytime you are stopped for more than 30 seconds. This will help Aurora's goal to reduce 80% of greenhouse gases by 2050. Please also consider carpooling your students to school. Many vehicles are picking up one single student. Work together to do our part Williams community!!

## **Driveway and Parking Lot**

At the end of the school day, the front driveway loop is closed to regular traffic from about 2:15 to 2:40. Only school taxis and buses are to use the front driveway loop at the end of the day in order to create a safe place for our students with special needs. Once all the school taxis and buses leave the front driveway loop around 2:40, regular traffic may use this area. To support our efforts to ensure physical distancing, we ask that you make arrangements to meet your students at the nearest exit from their classroom (in one of the parking lots) or off school property (down the street, around the corner, etc.). Please see the maps below to support your efforts.



There is one-way traffic in our front driveway loop. In the front driveway loop, drop off/pick up students on the right side; drive through only on the left side. For safety reasons, do not drop off/pick up students on the left side.



If you MUST come to the school, enter via the West lot (beside the track, closest to Yonge Street) and drive around the school to meet your child. DO NOT block the driveway waiting. There is one-way traffic in the west entrance and on the south (back) side of the school. It is two-way traffic on the east side of the school, however, during the end of the day pick-up time you will notice the admin directing all vehicles to enter the west lot ONLY

so that we have a constant flow out of the east lot. This makes a significant positive impact on safety for all and makes it easier and less stressful for everyone. When you are able to enter the east lot, do not make U-turns anywhere in the east parking lot from Dunning Avenue to the south parking lot. Making a U-turn in this area creates an unsafe condition for pedestrians and other vehicles. If you need to turn around, please pull into a parking spot and carefully back out.



Please note that Dunning Avenue is a **no stopping zone**. This is noted by the signage along the street and on the map above you can see the red arrows on both sides of the street.
