#### **Tragic Events**

Here are some suggestions on handling tragic events with children.

Families are encouraged to:

- spend time together,
- limit media exposure to the event,
- create time for conversation and checking in, •
- validate their child's feelings, •
- ask for help as needed, and ۲
- find calm and relaxing activities to do at home.

It is very important to limit exposure to media coverage, particularly for young children. If children or youth are watching the news or accessing information online, parents and caregivers should be available to check in and talk to their children about it.

Families and educators will support children and youth to understand and cope with the impact of death and feelings of loss. Most children and youth are resilient and will cope well with the support and caring of their families, teachers, friends, and other caring adults. However, young children may have particular difficulty understanding and describing their feelings and emotions.

Parents can contact the school's Guidance Department if their child needs further support.

- Login to MyPathwayPlanner: My Pathway Planner
- Select "High School"
- Populate your High School Plan by clicking the + symbol to choose courses for the 2020/2021 school year.
- In addition, please be sure to indicate your choices for the next school year and any summer school intentions that you may have.
- Then "Review" your course selections and print the "Course Selection Sign-Off Sheet"
- Graduating? If yes, complete a "Not-Returning Form" on My Pathway Planner and submit the Sign-Off form to the Guidance Office by February 21, 2020.

#### **Graduation: Important Dates**

This year, Graduation will be held at the Ray Twinney Recreation Complex (Arena #1), 100 Eagle Street West in Newmarket, on Thursday, June 25 at 6:30 p.m. Graduating students who wish to attend the ceremony must pay their grad fee by May 4. This ensures that a graduation cap and gown will be ordered for them. If a graduate or their guests require accessibility accommodations (such as a sign language interpreter), you must notify the principal in writing by May 4.

Graduating students must complete and submit their community involvement hours to Guidance by Tuesday, May 19.

Applications for school awards are due to Guidance by Tuesday, May 19.

Graduating students who are taking private school courses must submit their private school final report card to Guidance no later than noon on Friday, June 19.

Four candidates will be selected to run for the two student trustee positions and all students will have an opportunity to vote in late February.

#### Aquatics Program

The Town of Aurora is proud to partner with the York Region District School Board's Continuing Education to offer the Aquatic Leadership Program. The two-part program is conducted in a blended learning format, which includes pool instruction, in-class instruction and online learning. Upon completion, successful students may earn certifications to be used to work as a lifeguard or a swim instructor.

Healthy Living and Aquatic Activities (PAQ2O1) – must be 13 years of age or older and eligible to earn high school credits – must be able to swim 400 metres continuously - earns a high school credit as well as Lifesaving Society's Bronze Medallion, Lifesaving Society's Bronze Cross, Lifesaving Society's Standard First Aid with CPR-C

Recreation and Healthy Active Living Leadership (PLF4M) – must be 16 years of age by the last day of the course, have Lifesaving Society's Bronze Cross and Standard First Aid with CPR-C – earns a high school credit as well as Lifesaving Society's national Lifeguard Pool, Lifesaving Society's Lifesaving Instructor, Red Cross' Water Safety Instructor

The course is being offered at the Stronach Aurora Recreation Complex (1400 Wellington Street East) on Mondays and Wednesdays from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m.

Students can register for the course in one of two methods:

- 1. Register through YRDSB's Continuing Education website
- 2. Register through the Town of Aurora's e-PLAY website. Each program costs \$250.00 per semester.

#### **Severe Weather**

In the event of severe weather, the Board has three levels of action:

• Extreme Cold Days when roads are clear, but extreme cold temperatures make it difficult for buses to operate reliably, posing a safety risk to students waiting at bus stops. Student transportation will be cancelled. Schools will otherwise operate as usual.

 Inclement Weather Days when road or weather conditions make it impossible to operate a school bus safely. Student transportation will be cancelled. Schools and workplaces will be open; however, all teachers may not be at school that day.

• Rare Emergency Weather Days (School Closures) when all schools and workplaces will be closed. Decisions about school closures will be made as early as possible, and no later than 6:00 a.m.

Severe weather information is communicated through local media outlets, the Student Transportation Services website, School Transportation Hotline: 1-877-330-3001, the Board's website and Twitter account, and on the Board and school's voicemail recording. Parents are responsible for using their best judgment to decide whether or not to send their child(ren) to school on days when buses are cancelled and schools remain open.

#### **Bus or School Cancellations**

When an inclement weather or extreme cold or day is declared, school transportation (including buses and taxis) are cancelled in the morning and afternoon. Schools will remain open. If you drive your child to school, or your child takes alternate transportation, you must make arrangements for your child to get home at the end of the school day. Please call the school if your child will not be attending school on those days. Students will not be penalized for missing school on these days.

There may be rare instances when emergency winter events occur and we need to close all schools and Board locations. Please take the time to make plans in the event of an emergency school closure.

Information about transportation cancellations and Board closures will be shared through local media, Board and school website and on twitter @YRDSB.

Our process for extreme cold, inclement weather and emergency weather days are outlined in the Board's Severe Weather policy, which has been recently updated and is available for public comment. Seeking feedback from staff and community members, including parents/guardians, is an important part of the review process. All policies available for comment are sent to school council chairs and are posted on the Board website, along with information about how to provide feedback.

#### **Driveway and Parking Lot**


The safety of all students must be everyone's first priority. Please follow the procedures below.

There is one-way traffic in our front driveway loop. In the front driveway loop, drop off/pick up students on the right side; drive through only on



the left side. For safety reasons, do not drop off/pick up students on the left side.

At the end of the school day, the front driveway loop is closed to regular traffic from about 2:40 to 3:15. Only school taxis and buses are to use the front driveway loop at the end of the day in order to create a safe place for our students with special needs. Once all the school taxis and buses leave the front driveway loop around 3:15, regular traffic may use this area.



There is one-way traffic in the west entrance and on the south (back) side of the school. It is two-way traffic on the east side of the school. Do not make U-turns anywhere in the east parking lot from Dunning Avenue to the south parking lot. Making a U-turn in this area creates an unsafe condition for pedestrians and other vehicles. If you need to turn around, please pull into a parking spot and carefully back out. Thank you for your cooperation with this!
