### **Severe Weather**

In the event of severe weather, the Board has three levels of action:

• Extreme Cold Days when roads are clear, but extreme cold temperatures make it difficult for buses to operate reliably, posing a safety risk to students waiting at bus stops. Student transportation will be cancelled. Schools will otherwise operate as usual.

• Inclement Weather Days when road or weather conditions make it impossible to operate a school bus safely. Student transportation will be cancelled. Schools and workplaces will be open; however, all teachers may not be at school that day.

• Rare Emergency Weather Days (School Closures) when all schools and workplaces will be closed. Decisions about school closures will be made as early as possible, and no later than 6:00 a.m.

Severe weather information is communicated through local media outlets, the Student Transportation Services website, School Transportation Hotline: 1-877-330-3001, the Board's website and Twitter account, and on the Board and school's voicemail recording.

Parents are responsible for using their best judgment to decide whether or not to send their child(ren) to school on days when buses are cancelled and schools remain open.

### Grade 8 Day and Grade 8 Information Night

On Wednesday, November 6, the school hosted about 400 Grade 8 students from our area elementary schools to provide them with a taste of high school. On Wednesday, November 13, the school will hold its annual Grade 8 Information Night for Grade 8 students and their parents. The evening begins with an information session in the cafetorium at 7:00 p.m. followed by department displays.

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- In 1763, King George III of Great Britain issued The Royal Proclamation, confirming the original occupancy of Indigenous peoples and paving the way for land agreements between the British Crown (government) and Indigenous peoples. The proclamation stated that settlers could not live on the land until the Crown had signed treaties with the First Nations who occupied the territories.
- Ontario has 46 Treaties.
- Indigenous people in Canada view themselves as separate and distinct peoples who have treaty rights due to their unique historical, legal, and political position.
- There are two types of land claims. Comprehensive land claims involve land not surrendered or ceded by treaty. Specific land claims are based on issues arising from non-fulfillment of a treaty agreement.
- Outstanding land claims and treaty issues are being negotiated through the modern land claims process.
- Although many treaties were signed more than a century ago, treaty commitments are just as valid today as they were then.
- Despite the promise of early treaties and the mutually respectful partnerships they established, Indigenous peoples were targeted by colonial policies designed to exploit, assimilate and eradicate them.
- Today, the Ontario government is working to rebuild trust and relationships with treaty partners and Indigenous peoples. Part of that effort includes educating Ontarians about the role treaties play in our lives and relationships with each other today.

### **Remembrance Day**

On Monday, the school will hold Remembrance Day assemblies during Periods 1A (mostly Grade 10 classes and some Grade 12 classes), 1B (mostly Grade 11 classes and some Grade 12 classes), and 2A (mostly Grade 9 classes).

Grad Photos are being taken the week of November 25th. More information will be coming soon regarding the on-line booking of Grad photos.




### **Driveway and Parking Lot**

The safety of all students must be everyone's first priority. Please follow the procedures below.

There is one-way traffic in our front driveway loop. In the front driveway loop, drop off/pick up students on the right side; drive through only on the left side. For safety reasons, do not drop off/pick up students on the left side.



At the end of the school day, the front driveway loop is closed to regular traffic from about 2:40 to 3:15. Only school taxis and buses are to use the front driveway loop at the end of the day in order to create a safe place for our students with special needs. Once all the school taxis and buses leave the front driveway loop around 3:15, regular traffic may use this area.



There is one-way traffic in the west entrance and on the south (back) side of the school. It is two-way traffic on the east side of the school. Do not make Uturns anywhere in the east parking lot from Dunning Avenue to the south parking lot. Making a U-turn in this area creates an unsafe condition for pedestrians and other vehicles. If you need to turn around, please pull into a parking spot and carefully back out. Thank you for your cooperation with this!
