Message from the Principal

Second semester is in full swing at Williams. Students are settled into their courses and we are now looking ahead to the 2023-2024 school year. Course selections opened for submission last week and **must be completed by this Thursday (February 24th)**. It is important that all students assess carefully what courses they will need and want for the coming school year as our staffing depends on this.

As a follow-up to the letter that was sent home to families last week, I want to thank upstanding students and staff that identified and called out the inappropriate act of anti Black racism and ableism to support our investigative efforts to address and issue consequences and initiate further education with students responsible. It is important that all students are reminded of their commitment to abide by the YRDSB Acceptable Use of Technology Agreement and be aware of digital citizenship responsibilities. This applies to any online interactions that have an impact on the school climate (whether during or outside of school). The admin team is committed to ensuring a safe environment for our students and staff and are especially concerned about the impacts of this incident on some of our staff members. We will continue our work in creating a truly equitable school where incidents such as these remain as outliers and not reflective of our school community. This work will also assist us in ensuring everyone will continue to demonstrate the ethical standard expected of all members of our school community. This work cannot be done in isolation and requires the commitment of all members of the school community (students, staff and families) to contribute in positive ways to resolve concerns and immediately call out inappropriate or hurtful actions so they can be addressed in a timely way.

We have two study tours being planned currently. Please see the information below regarding information sessions for each of these opportunities. The Quebec tour is for May of this year and is approved in principle (dependent on enough student interest) and the D-Day Trip for June 2024 will be submitted for approval once the staff determines there is sufficient interest. We would like all students that would be interested to have the opportunity to participate in these extended study trips. We know that trips like these are expensive. Please reach out to the staff organizers or the administration if there is any way we can assist your student to be able to participate.

Enjoy this long weekend. We hope that our students and staff engage in some much needed rest and we look forward to seeing parents at our School Council meeting on Tuesday.

IMPORTANT UPDATES

- Course Selections open on February 16 and are due by February 24th.
 - Using the pathway planner on myBlueprint, students can:
 - Indicate they are not returning to GWW for the next school year.
 - Opt out of the e-learning requirement (if students are in grade 9 or 10).
 - Express interest in taking a summer school course this year. Please note this is not registration that will happen later this spring. If a student intends to take summer school, <u>do not</u> select that course for next year.
- Graduates of 2023 must complete and submit their volunteer hours by Tuesday, May 23rd, 2023.

Attendance Procedures

Extended Absences

Planned absences of three or more consecutive school days require the completion of an "Extraordinary Absence" form at least one week in advance of the leave. The form is available in the Attendance Office. The process includes obtaining signatures from teachers and a school administrator. It is the student's responsibility to catch up on all work missed.

Parents/guardians should contact the Attendance Office to indicate when their child will be absent. The Attendance Office can be reached at 905-727-3131 ext. 100. If the attendance secretary is busy please leave a voice message OR send an email to drgwwilliamsss.attendance@yrdsb.ca. If a student leaves school resulting in a late or an absence to a class period, they are to go to the attendance office to sign out. If a student arrives late for Period 1 and before 8:45 a.m., they are asked to report directly to their class where their homeroom teacher will let the office know the time of arrival. If the 8:20 bell has rung, students are asked to stand in the hallway for the anthem and announcements to be completed before proceeding to their period 1 class. For any other period, whenever a student arrives at school after the first scheduled class period has begun they are to report to attendance to sign in.

Students are expected to be in class by the times listed above.

Students, parents, and staff have a role to play in ensuring that students attend classes regularly and punctually. Students are responsible for:

- attending all scheduled classes, and being on time;
- being prepared for classes, and participating fully in the planned learning activities;
- reporting absences (preferably in advance), and presenting proper documentation to staff, and covering the material missed when they are absent.

Absences must be both valid and authorized by a parent. Examples of valid reasons include illness, bereavement, medical appointments, court appearance, etc. If no phone call, e-mail, or note is received by the school, the absence will be considered "truant". Truancies are unacceptable.

Students who have been signed out of classes by a parent/legal guardian cannot remain on school property.

Parent(s)/guardian(s) and students aged 18 and older and students who have declared their independence must report all absences, late arrivals and/or changes to departure plans to the school in a timely manner. Where possible, notify the school in advance by calling the school and leaving a message on the answering machine or emailing the school's attendance address.

If a student is unable to attend school and will miss more than two school days, homework may be requested from the Guidance Department and picked up at the school. Teachers require 24 hours to complete homework requests. If a student is absent due to a prolonged illness, he/she may be required to provide a medical note.





Driveway and Parking Lot


At the end of the school day, the front driveway loop is closed to regular traffic from about 2:50 to 3:10 pm. Only school taxis and buses are to use the front driveway loop at the end of the day in order to create a safe place for our students with special needs. Once all the school taxis and buses leave the front driveway loop around 3:10, regular traffic may use this area. To support our efforts to ensure physical distance, we ask that you make arrangements to meet your students at the nearest exit from their classroom (in one of the parking lots) or off school property (down the street, around the corner, etc.). Please see the maps below to support your efforts.



There is one-way traffic in our front driveway loop. In the front driveway loop, drop off/pick up students on the right side; drive through only on the left side. For safety reasons, do not drop off/pick up students on the left side.



If you MUST come to the school, enter via the West lot (beside the track, closest to Yonge Street) and drive around the school to meet your child. DO NOT block the driveway waiting. There is one-way traffic in the west entrance and on the south (back) side of the school. It is two-way traffic on the east side of the school, however, during the end of the day pick-up time you will notice the admin directing all vehicles to enter the west lot ONLY so that we have a constant flow out of the east lot. This makes a significant positive impact on safety for all and makes it easier and less stressful for everyone. When you are able to enter the east lot, do not make U-turns anywhere in the east parking lot from Dunning Avenue to the south parking lot. Making a U-turn in this area creates an unsafe condition for pedestrians and other vehicles. If you need to turn around, please pull into a parking spot and carefully back out.



Please note that Dunning Avenue is a **no stopping zone**. This is noted by the signage along the street and on the map above you can see the red arrows on both sides of the street.
