3	Administration Report: Christopher Hilmer, Diane Conlon 13 new international students 2 nd semester. Two-day orientation shadowing a current student. Semester 2 timetables were handed out in December. Any timetable issues - seek guidance counselling PA day- February 1 st – Indigenous Education & Equity, recommendations 62 & 63 Cultural Competency Learning Opportunities: Truth and Reconciliation Commission. Semester 1 exams start Thursday, January 24 - all written exams start at 9am each day. Wednesday 30 th is not the inclement weather day moved to 31 st as directed by YRDSB. January 31 st exam feedback day has shortened periods for students to go over exams, ask final questions and receive final marks. Fundraising Update: Lisa Phillips

- Ideas
- From past success food related work well. Considered Kernels as one to start with, Friday often successful. Other foods available healthy snacks.. Frozen yogurt also proved successful for warmer months. Cafeteria limitations on times we can sell to consider
- 2) Fund to orgs, gently used shoe selection. Shoes waiting for them to call back if moving into this area with their programme, expect more information Jan/Feb.
- 3) 50/50 raffle 50/50 requires lottery licence from town? Full community define how to sell to students/parent.
- 4) Outdoor bbg hotdog pizza burger day recruit teachers and parents
- 5) Teachers in jail faculty stay in classroom while students have free period/gym time. Teachers in detention would prefer to re-name rates to be defined by class or which teachers, students raise money to detain teacher. Similar to "buy in" fundraiser for charity e.g. teacher vs student game, during period 4 students buy in for nominal fee to be excused from class. Need to ensure any students can go, by class would need minimum class suggested \$150 buy in to activity or event.
- 6) Tournament video game marathon, puzzles/games or movie nights. Permit to 10pm, need staff supervision and pre-organised, more to consider with set up of computers and prizes

Pursue Kernels popcorn sales

Specific groups could run the fundraising or school overall benefit.

After school grabbing snacks without cafeteria limitations, allowed 10 bake sales per year already used for groups raising funds for charities (require notice). Popcorn falls within heathy foods guidelines.

For students heading for bus needs to be fast or high volume and efficient sales. Nothing in local area to rival, consider selling water as well. Kernels are already bagged and last 3 months.

Requires parent & student volunteers, parents set up and stay for money counting. Consider month for Fridays. Then fundraising groups could make their own for their group fundraising. Could lead to each club signed up for week as previous example.

Start February, trial 1 month, Kernels deliver to school. Start Thursday & Friday, include announcement reminders to bring \$2. Kernels delivers to school, idea to set up at front and back doors

Need 1 week notice to place and receive order, consider tournaments dates for future sales, just for elementary only. (Denison upgrade to field & track, track & field has moved to their new facilities for 2019. Williams will host gym sports).

Action: to proceed with popcorn starting February and organise logistics. Lynn & Lisa to co-ordinate.

Coupon book - Lynn on behalf of Yevgenia Casale

- Printed coupons canvass local business different to SPC card. Shop local theme, clothing, food. Print offers as coupons in book and sell coupon books to students
- · Asking businesses that appear in book to also donate \$30 to cover printing of books and as buy in to honour coupons. Have books printed and for sale, to offset cost hopefully \$5/\$10 per book. Looking at minimal price point and access, if anyone has ideas for businesses that might be interested. Next phase to explore businesses that may be interested. Thinking in radius of school/Aurora. Coupons for families not just students. Thinking to spread work across volunteers for communicating/distributing letters to local businesses.
