All our Grade 3 students will be taking part in the provincial Math Assessment in French and our 6 students will be taking part in Reading, Writing and Mathematics assessments in English. The EQAO assessments will be administered between May 25 and June 5. Parents are asked to avoid scheduling appointments or holidays during the dates and time noted above.
