## Grade 1 French Immersion Information Night

Our new Grade 1 Parent Information Night will take place on January 14 at 7 p.m. here at Elder's Mills Public School and registrations will take place from January 15-February 12, 2016.

Card Collections, i-Pods, MP3
Players, Toys, Walkmans, and
Other Valuables: We strongly discourage students from bringing these items to school as they can get broken, misplaced or stolen. They also become the cause of arguments. Should students bring these items to school, they must remain in their backpack and not be taken out in class or put in their desks. We are not banning these items at this time, but students need to understand that if they bring them to school, they do so at their own risk.

Safe Play Guidelines: In order to prevent physical injury and because of our concern for student safety, students are expected to avoid activities that involve aggressive play and physical contact. Recess activities that are not acceptable include wrestling, piggybacking, football, lacrosse, tripping, baseball, pushing, shoving, body-checking, poking, punching, play fighting and other forms of rough play in busses, stairwells, hallways and playgrounds. During recess breaks, students are able to play organized games such as basketball, soccer and foot hockey as well as activities such as skipping and tag. We ask parents to regularly review these expectations with their son/daughter to ensure that our school is a safe place for everyone. Thank you in advance for your support!
