# **Caring & Safe Schools**

#### **Anti-Racism Education**

On November 9, our community partners at York Region Police's Diversity &

Cultural Unit visited Elder's Mills and spoke with students about the importance of having a safe, supportive and inclusive school and community. Students from grade 1-7 took an active interest in their talk and the resources they shared. The key message to all was that in showing empathy within their school, students play a significant role in making their school safe, supportive and inclusive.

#### **School Climate Assembly**

On November 24, we held two follow-up student assemblies to review school routines and safe, appropriate play in the yard and in school buses. Other topics included a discussion about the proper use of technology and respect for the property of others, including personal belongings in lockers and classroom and on buses and coat hooks.



With the cold weather upon us, students are reminded to dress warmly for outdoor recess. Also for those wet wintery days, we ask parents to pack extra clothing ie: pants, socks and mittens. In terms of recess, students must play with snow in a safe manner and not throw snow, snowball or ice as this can cause serious injury to peers. Students who do not observe this safety expectation will be spoken to by staff on yard supervision, asked to walk with supervisors, be given a time out, or report to the school office to see Mme Walke.
