

Astroneer is a space colony game with stunning graphics. You can explore many different planets, gather resources, and build tech to help you on your colonization journey.





Astroneer has you start out on a randomly generated planet, from which you can use tools to collect materials. Using the materials, you can build different kinds of tech, including lights, rockets, storage units, and research stations.

The game has beautiful soundtracks and visuals. Astroneer also has a goal. There are Gateway Engines; structures that make up the cores of each planet. Also, there are Gateway Chambers, 6 in total which are located on each planet. Each Gateway Chamber requires a power source to activate. Once all 6 are activated, the Gateway Engine of that planet will be activated. It will also give you an Odd Stone. What do you do with it? You'll have to find out.


Ramadan & Eid By: Aaiza & Emma
