We will be inviting all students in Grades 4-12 and students in Grades K-3 to participate in the 2022-23 Every Student Counts Survey in the Spring of 2023. Surveys will be available online and will take approximately 20 minutes to complete.

You and your child should have received a letter from the Board notifying them that the survey will be taking place. The surveys will provide the Board and our schools with valuable information about the learning experiences of students and families this year that are used to inform Board and school planning and to support student achievement and well-being.

Students in Grades 4-12 will be given class time to complete the survey at schools. Students in Grades K-3 are encouraged to complete the survey at home with their family. Families who do not want their child(ren) to be sent an invitation to participate in the survey will be given a chance to opt their child out of receiving the survey in the new calendar year.



As our first partners in education, we value input from families and encourage parents/guardians to complete the survey. The information provided will be confidential and kept in strict accordance with all relevant legislation.

Le 11 novembre, nous portons un coquelicot pour nous souvenir de tous ceux qui ont combattu dans la guerre. Le jour du Souvenir est un jour commémoratif observé dans les États membres du Commonwealth depuis la fin de la Première Guerre mondiale pour rendre hommage aux membres des forces armées morts dans l'exercice de leurs fonctions. Suivant une tradition inaugurée par le roi George V en 1919, ce jour est également marqué par des commémorations de la guerre dans de nombreux pays non membres du Commonwealth. C'est un jour où tu peux penser aux soldats et les remercier. De nombreux soldats ont risqué leur vie pour nous, le pays, la paix et l'avenir.





Le jour du souvenir continuation

On arrête le 11 novembre chaque année car la guerre mondiale s'est arrêtée à 11 heures, le 11e jour du 11e mois. On fait deux minutes de silence pour se souvenir des soldats. Le coquelicot est le symbole du jour du souvenir. Le jour du souvenir est un jour de réunion et d'un meilleur avenir. William Nelson Edward Hall VC a été le premier Noir, le premier Néo-Écossais et le troisième Canadien à recevoir la Croix de Victoria. Il a reçu la médaille pour ses actions lors du siège de Lucknow en 1857, pendant la rébellion indienne.







Ascending Sisters Pilot Project:

Elder's Mills is pleased to announce that it is one of the schools piloting the Ascending Sisters Mentorship Program. In alignment with the Dismantling Anti-Black Racism Strategy, Ascending Sisters serves as a mentorship program that connects Black girls and non binary students with self-identified Black YRDSB staff (e.g., teachers, educational assistants, Child and Youth workers, support professionals, administrators). Cisgender girls, transgender girls and non binary students from grades 7-10 in selected pilot schools are all welcome to participate.

Through targeted wellness, health and mentorship opportunities, students will be provided with the opportunity to develop a stronger sense of self, promote healing, increase ability to advocate, communicate effectively and further enhance their leadership skills.




