## School Start up Package - Start-Up Forms:

<u>Please complete and submit these online School Start-Up Forms</u> through your child's YRDSB Google account.

- You can access your child's YRDSB Google account via a web browser. For best results, use a computer rather than a mobile phone.
- The username is your child's YRDSB Student Number. Your child will receive their login information from the school at the start of the year. If you or your child do not know the password to log in to their Google account, please contact your child's teacher or the school office.
- Frequently asked questions and additional information on how to complete the forms are available
  on the Board website under <u>Family Resources</u> (click on the "Need Help" link for Family Start-Up
  Forms.

It is important that these forms are completed as soon as possible at the start of the school year. There are both mandatory and optional forms. The forms are to be completed for all students, whether they are attending school in person or participating in remote, online learning. Your child's school will access the information.

Please complete a separate form for each child attending our schools. Secondary school students will also

be asked to review important school and Board policies and to indicate that they have reviewed this information on forms sent to their student GAPPS account.

**Caring and Safe Schools Presentations:** 



As we start a new school year, it is important to us that we provide a caring, safe and inclusive environment in our school that supports the academic achievement and well-being of all students. This week we held assemblies to talk about some of the important elements of a caring and safe school. You may want to have a conversation with your child about what they learned about and what we discussed. Topics covered included:

## Inappropriate Behaviour

Students are learning about about racism, discrimination and bullying and this learning will continue through the school year. Instances of racism, discrimination and bullying, are not acceptable and are addressed through progressive discipline. Students also need to know about safe behaviours in schools including what not to bring to school such as no peanut products, vape products, weapons (including replica weapons).

#### Reporting Behaviour

Standing up for one another and reporting when something does not feel safe is part of a caring and safe school environment. Students should report incidents that make them or others feel unsafe or uncomforable including acts of racism, discrimination and bullying. Students can report incidents by:

- Telling a caring adult
- Using the YRDSB's <u>"Report It Button"</u> (located on our school website) YRDSB's online Report
  It button allows students and families to share information about inappropriate behaviour
  and/or incidents of hate or discrimination. Please see <u>this video</u> for additional information.

#### Mental Health

We want to stress with students the importance of connection as we return to school. Students are learning about who they can talk to if they need support. Positive mental health is closely tied to a sense of identity and safety for each individual. As such, mental health initiatives are aligned with equity and safety in mind which includes culturally specific supports. YRDSB student mental health services are delivered by Board social work and psychology staff. These services are accessible through the school principal. Mental health resources for families are also available on the Board website.

#### Student Discipline

We use a progressive discipline approach for inappropriate behaviour. This means we consider a range of options to determine the most appropriate response to each situation to help students learn from their choices. In some cases, suspension or expulsion may be necessary. The Ontario Education Act and the Board's Caring and Safe Schools Policy (found on the Board's Caring and Safe School Page) outline the situations in which suspension and expulsion must be considered. These infractions are also outlined in the Guide to the School Year. When inappropriate behaviour occurs, information will be shared with the victim and parents/guardians of the victim to the extent that legislation allows.

## Tobacco/Alcohol/Drug-Free Environment

The use of tobacco, electronic products (such as <u>vaping</u>, <u>electronic cigarettes</u> and related products) and/or student possession of alcohol/illegal and restricted drugs, including cannabis, are prohibited on school property or within 20 metres of school boundaries. This is in compliance with the Smoke-Free Ontario Act, which is enforced locally by York Region Community and Health Services. A progressive form of discipline, including suspension from school and fines (up to \$5,000) may apply. In accordance with the Smoke-Free Ontario Act (SFOA), exceptions are made for the traditional use of tobacco that forms part of Indigenous culture and spirituality.

## Online Safety and Appropriate Use of Technology

Students are reminded about the Appropriate Use of Technology agreement, including the importance of using respectful language and making positive choices when using electronic communications and social media tools.

Students are reminded that threats and comments made online are taken seriously and may have serious consequences, including potential criminal charges. Where there are concerns for the safety of students, staff, community members or Board property, the school board works with York Regional Police and appropriate actions are taken. The safety and well-being of students remains our top priority.

## **Orange Shirt Day:**

Orange Shirt Day is an annual Canada-wide event that began in 2013 to educate people and promote awareness in Canada about the residential school system and the impact it has had on Indigenous communities for over a century—an impact that continues today. All Canadians are encouraged to wear an orange shirt on September 30 to commemorate the history and legacy of residential schools and to recognize the resiliency and bravery of residential school survivors. At EMPS, we invite all staff and students to wear an orange shirt on Friday, September 30th, 2022.



## Use of Non-Board Electronic Devices (Mobile phones, laptops, tablets...) at Elder's Mills:

- Students in our grades 5 8 classes may bring personal electronic devices such as a tablet or a laptop into the classroom for instructional purposes only.
- Personal computers and tablets are used when instructed by and under the supervision of the teacher no personal gaming etc...
- Mobile phones are discouraged and are not allowed to be used during the instructional day.
- Cell phones and other personal communication devices must be turned off and kept out of sight during the instructional day (including recess and lunch). Should students need to phone home, they may come to the office to use the phone.
- At no time may electronic devices be used in washrooms or changerooms.
- Please review YRDSB's Information Technology Acceptable Use Agreement linked here.
- This information will be repeated in the forms requiring parent and student signatures found
  in the School Start-Up Package that will be sent home next week.

Students and parents/guardians must remember to sign and return the Appropriate Use of Technology Agreement in the School Start Up package prior to being granted access to school or Board technology, hardware or network.

#### **Lunch Time Agreement:**

Students who do not go home for lunch will remain at school throughout the lunch hour. We ask that you reinforce with your child that you are putting your trust in them to refrain from learning school grounds without your knowledge.

Students who leave school property for lunch must be signed out by a parent/guardian, otherwise students must stay at school.

#### **Medication And Health Needs:**



Please provide the office with your child's medication from the first day of school. You may drop off the medication after morning arrival, by ringing the front bell and office staff will greet you to retrieve your child's medication.

For students who are anaphylactic, please send your child to school with 2 epi-pens. One will be kept in the office and the other will remain with your child throughout the school day.

- Complete training, as required.


