#### Ramadan @ EMPS:



### **APRIL IS SIKH HERITAGE MONTH:**

On April 1st, 2021 Minister Bardish Chagger issued the following statement from Ottawa:

"Canada is proud to be home to more than 500,000 Sikh Canadians, making it one of the largest Sikh diasporas in the world. Since the arrival of the first Sikh immigrants in the late 19th century, members of this community have contributed to Canada through their achievements in all areas of society and have helped shape the diversity found within it.

Sikhism's core principles include equality, generosity, openness, and compassion. Sikh Heritage Month is an opportunity to reflect on the pivotal role that Sikh communities have played, and continue to play, in building a stronger and consciously more inclusive Canada."

April is an important month for the Sikh community. In this month, Sikh Canadians celebrate Vaisakhi, which marks the creation of the Khalsa and the Sikh articles of faith. Sikh Canadians widely celebrate Vaisakhi, also known as Khalsa Day, across Ontario.

#### **MESSAGES FROM THE OFFICE**

<u>Be Allergy Aware!</u> At Elder's Mills, we are a nut-aware school. Students with anaphylaxis are aware of how to keep themselves safe (e.g. not eating unknown foods, carrying an epi-pen, hand-washing, eating in a separate space in the classroom). Our staff is aware of the potential risk to students and receive training for administering an epi-pen. Unfortunately, we are not able to check all snacks and lunches to ensure they are nut-free.

We ask that all families and children in this class do their part to help their allergic classmates stay safe. We can reduce the risk of accidental exposure with your help.



#### Please:

- DO NOT send peanut/tree-nut containing products to school.
- remind your child that food in their snack or lunch is not to be shared
- do not send food to school for sharing with classmates (e.g. birthday or other celebrations)
- Be mindful of foods from establishments (e.g. Tim Horton's, McDonald's) where they are not a nut-free facility

Your cooperation and understanding of this matter is greatly appreciated.

Please make sure that your children are dressed properly for the weather. Please expect that your child will be going out for recess every day, unless it's raining. Children may get wet, muddy, and dirty when playing during recess. A change of clothes is often necessary due to the wet weather of the Spring months. To minimize disruptions to the school day with students calling home for a change of clothes or to avoid having students in wet pants, shoes or socks for the remainder of the day, please provide a change of clothes (e.g.

extra pants and socks) and a change of shoes. Students are asked to have a pair of indoor shoes at school so that they may change out of their outdoor shoes prior to entering the classroom. Please be sure to label all articles of clothing.

#### 6 First Day of Pesah - Judaism

Pesah (Passover) commemorates the departure of Israelites from slavery in Egypt. The festival of Passover is celebrated for eight days, the first two and last two days are observed as holy days. The evenings of the first and second days of Pesah begin with Seder meals (festive meals and the telling of the Passover story). The final day of Pesah marks the Israelites' crossing of the Reed Sea, as related in The Book of Exodus.

## 7 Good Friday (W) - Christianity

Good Friday commemorates the passion and death of Jesus Christ. It is a solemn, holy day for Christians. Good Friday may be marked by attending Church services and by observing a fast. Many Christians break the Good Friday fast after a candle-lit Easter vigil which occurs on the Saturday evening after Good Friday.
