Big Box of Cards Fundraiser!

The Big Box of Cards is a set of 35 All Birthday cards for the low price of \$35.00 per box. Each family would have received a box on Tuesday, April 4th. In the bag with the box was a sheet of instructions. Here are some answers to frequently asked questions about this campaign:



Frequently Asked Questions:

- What do I do if I don't want to participate?
 - o Return the box with all the cards, in its original condition, to the school office
- What do I do with the order form that came with the box?
 - This is for your reference only. Keep track of the boxes you sell so that when you receive delivery of your orders you will know who purchased from you
- I've sold the box that was sent home, how do I get more to sell?
 - Use the box that was sent home as the 'sample' to show your family and friends
 - Once sales are finished, place your order on School Cash online and pay for the number of boxes sold
 - Boxes will be sent home at the end of April/beginning of May so that you can fulfill your orders
 - For example: If you sell 10 boxes, you will make a payment on School Cash online for \$350.00; we will send home 9 boxes with your child. You will use the one that was sent home as part of your order.

Don't forget our amazing prizes!! For every two boxes of cards your family sells, your child's name will be placed in a draw to win one of four \$25 gift cards at local retailers like Cineplex, Toys R Us, Indigo, Walmart and Amazon. There is also the possibility to award a Samsung 8" Tablet 'A' to the top seller if the school reaches sales of 400 boxes or more!

All funds raised will support school fundraising goals in the areas of STEM, Literacy, Mental Health and Well-Being.

Caring & Safe Schools @ EMPS: Technology Use

We recognize that learning can be enhanced by technology and we have created opportunities in our classrooms to leverage digital tools to enhance teaching, learning and communication. Discussions about the impact of digital footprints and how a positive attitude toward using technology supports collaboration, learning and productivity are ongoing in our classrooms.

At Elder's Mills, personal mobile devices/laptops are permitted at school for our grades 5 - 8 classes. We are reaching out to our families for support regarding the appropriate use of technology both on

and off-school property. Please continue to engage in conversations with your children regarding respectful and appropriate use of this tool and the privilege and responsibilities that come with it.

To support these conversations, we are highlighting some of the school's and Board's expectations and understandings regarding technology use. Some of these continue to be a challenge for our students.

When using technology, students are accountable for:

- Following the Caring and Safe Schools Policy and the school code of conduct.
- Treating technology with respect.
- Being respectful when writing messages and sharing ideas while using technology.
- Respecting others' privacy and personal information, including passwords.
- Keeping personal information private (e.g. not publishing photos, names, addresses or phone numbers on the internet).
- Using technology responsibly for educational purposes as assigned by a teacher.
 - Cell phones and other personal communication devices must be turned off and kept out of sight during all instructional periods, except with the clear permission of the principal or the classroom teacher.
- Reporting inappropriate or uncomfortable situations involving technology to a staff member.
- Camera and/or video functions on mobile devices are not permitted for use on school property without clear permission from the principal or teacher. Infractions will be dealt with as student discipline, under the Caring and Safe Schools Policy and its related procedures.
- At no time may electronic devices be used in washrooms or changerooms.
- Students are responsible for the care and security of their personal devices. The school is not responsible for any damage, loss or theft.

Families are invited to review YRDSB's <u>guidelines for technology use</u> by referring to the Guide to the School Year and the School Start-Up package shared in September.

We thank you for your understanding and your ongoing support as we continue to reinforce for and instill in our children their responsibilities to themselves, their peers, their families and their school community in contributing to caring and safe environments for all.

Ramadan @ EMPS:



APRIL IS SIKH HERITAGE MONTH:

On April 1st, 2021 Minister Bardish Chagger issued the following statement from Ottawa:
