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Art Mural Project

At Elder's Mills we are creating spaces to celebrate and affirm the diverse identities of our community. In the Spring of 2024, EMPS students and staff engaged with artist Cindy Scaiffe, to create this mural for our atrium. The mural displays our school mascot, the eagle, soaring above and watching over us. The sky, feathers and body of the eagle are composed of over 600 round discs. Each student and staff member was asked to think about how they might represent



their identity on this disc. To think about who they are, what they like, where they are from and more. The result is their creation of a symbol or icon that contributes to the entire eagle. The project was mounted this past Tuesday and it was so uplifting to see and hear students and staff passing through the halls, looking to find their piece. This project serves as a cornerstone, a reminder that we all belong, we all matter and we are all Eagles, 'soaring strong and true' at Elder's Mills.

Safety Week - September 23 - 26 2024


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Terry Fox School Run @ Elder's Mills PS:

Meet the Teacher!

On Thursday evening **September 26**, you are invited to join us for **Meet the Teacher Night**. We are so excited to be opening up our doors to our families this evening!

Teachers will open their classrooms from 6:00 p.m. -7:00 p.m. for families to visit. Families will have the opportunity to meet the teacher and learn about



classroom routines, expectations, hear about the learning themes and goals for the grade, and to see the classroom.

Our School Council will also be available to connect with families. Stop by their table in the main hall and consider joining one of the Council's subcommittees (e.g. Fundraising, Programming) or signing



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up to volunteer for a number of opportunities throughout the year.

The classroom visits will be organized into two blocks in an effort to allow families with more than one child in more than one grade to visit their children's classrooms. Feel free to visit classes in either one of two sessions:

This evening is intended for an introduction to the classroom, the grade and the teacher. Please do not expect the teacher to speak to you about your individual child's progress during this visit. Formal opportunities to meet with and discuss your child's progress will be during the Parent/Teacher conferences in November, after Progress Reports are sent home.

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day:

Every year on September 30, Canadians observe National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day. It is a day to educate and promote awareness of residential schools and their lasting legacies of trauma, suffering and genocide of Indigenous Peoples. These institutions were designed to assimilate Indigenous children and to eradicate Indigenous cultural practices. The topic of residential schools first appears in the newly revised Social Studies curriculum in Grade 1. Given the observance of Orange Shirt Day and the National Day for Truth and Peconciliation, many Educators K-12 will take on this topic as part of their instructional

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National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, observed on September 30th in Canada, is a solemn occasion dedicated to acknowledging the historical and ongoing injustices faced by First Nations, Métis and Inuit. It serves as a vital step towards reconciliation and understanding, providing an opportunity to learn about the painful legacy of residential schools and the enduring trauma experienced by Indigenous communities. On this day, schools across the country also recognize Orange Shirt Day, which specifically remembers the story of Phyllis Webstad, a survivor of the residential school system, who had her new orange shirt taken away on her first day at school. These events in schools take on a solemn tone as students and educators engage in activities and discussions that foster empathy, respect, and awareness of the hardships endured by First Nations, Métis and Inuit, promoting a more inclusive and equitable society for future generations. We encourage YRDSB staff and students to wear an orange shirt on Monday, September 30, 2024, to recognize the resiliency, bravery and survival of Residential School Survivors and those who did not come home.

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Indigenous Languages and International Languages (ILIL) Program

The York Region District School Board offers language learning for students in the elementary level (SK to Grade 8) and at the secondary level (Grades 9 to 12).

Elementary

The elementary courses are extra-curricular language learning available for in-person or online classes. Classes are 2.5 hours and run once a week between Tuesday to Friday evenings (6:00 PM to 8:30 PM) or Saturday mornings (9:30 AM to 12:00 PM*).

Online registration opens on **Thursday, May 30, 2024**. To attend the full language program in its entirety, be sure to register by **Monday, September 9, 2024**.

Secondary

The secondary courses are credit-bearing, running once a week for 3.7 hours. Fall classes are year-long, running once a week on Wednesday evenings (5:45 PM to 9:25 PM) or Saturday mornings (8:45 AM to 12:25 PM).

Fall registration will open in mid-July and will close by the third week of classes.
