May is Asian and South Asian Heritage Month and Canadian Jewish Heritage Month:

In May 2002, the Government of Canada signed an <u>official declaration</u> to designate May as Asian Heritage Month. At the provincial level, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario designated May as <u>South Asian Heritage Month</u> in 2001 and as Asian Heritage Month in 2005. As we approach the month of May, communities across Canada will be coming together to understand, affirm and appreciate the vibrant heritages of Canadians of the Asian and South Asian diaspora.



<u>Canadian Jewish Heritage Month</u> was given Royal Assent in the Legislative Assembly of Ontario (Jewish Heritage Month Act, 2012, S.O. 2012, c. 1 - Bill 17) on April 24, 2012 and in the Senate of Canada on March 29, 2018. As we approach the month of May, staff and students are encouraged to engage in opportunities that celebrate and affirm Jewish histories and the achievements of the Jewish community.

Canada is home to the fourth largest Jewish population in the world. There are close to 400,000 Jewish residents in Canada, and almost half of that number reside in Ontario. Jewish settlers in Canada can be traced as far back as 1760. Jewish Canadians have proudly contributed to Canadian heritage in all of its facets including the military, the arts, government, business, academia, law, medicine, culture, and sports. Throughout the month of May, we celebrate the contributions Jewish Canadians make in communities across the country.

SPRING HAS ARRIVED and so have the mud and puddles!

Please make sure that your children are dressed properly for the weather. Please expect that your child will be going out for recess every day, unless it's raining. Children may get wet, muddy, and dirty when playing during recess. To minimize disruptions to the school day with students calling home for a change of clothes or to avoid having students in wet pants, shoes or socks for the remainder of the day, please send a change of clothes (e.g. extra pants and socks) and a change of shoes.



Students are asked to have a pair of indoor shoes at school so that they may change out of their outdoor shoes prior to entering the classroom. Please be sure to label all articles of clothing.

Arrivals to School

Consistent late arrivals impact your child's learning in several ways. . We request your support in getting your child to school on time.



Classes start and attendance is taken at 8:45 a.m. If you are driving your child to school, or if they are walking, they can arrive as early as 8:30 a.m. when supervision is available in the school yard. Parents and caregivers please support positive habits about school attendance.

We have a high volume of late arrivals that are not attributed to late buses. If you know that your child will be arriving late to school, please indicate this in Edsby. Students not accounted for when attendance is taken are considered absent until they arrive. Your communication about late arrival supports us in ensuring all students are safe at school.

Please let us know how we may support you and your child in setting them up for success as we come to the end of this term and prepare for the next school year.
