Pride Month is an opportunity for schools to embrace inclusion and celebrate diversity.

Pride Flags

It is the goal of YRDSB to make visible our commitment to safer environments and more inclusive schools for 2SLGBTQAI+ students, staff and community, and as such, it is our expectation in YRDSB that Pride flags be flown at all schools and workplaces for the month of June.. The introduction of the new Progress Pride Flag allows schools to show representation of marginalized identities in the community. The significance of the colours in the Progress Pride flag are as follows:

- yellow background with the purple circle recognizes intersex experiences
- pink, white and blue represent trans experiences, and
- black and brown represent intersectional racialized experiences.

The colours from the original pride flag represent life, healing, sunlight, nature, harmony and spirit in the order in which they appear from top to bottom.





June is National Indigenous History month

In June, Canadians celebrate National Indigenous History Month to honour the history, heritage and diversity of First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples in Canada. It is also an opportunity to recognize the strength of present-day First Nations, Inuit and Métis communities. National Indigenous History Month is a time for learning about, appreciating and acknowledging the First Nations, Inuit and Métis

people in Canada. The Canadian Government unanimously declared June as **National Indigenous History Month** in 2009 through a motion in the House of Commons. The month, which includes National Indigenous Peoples Day, is a perfect time to reflect upon the long relationship between the many different Indigenous peoples of Turtle Island and Canadians throughout history. It is a good time to become better acquainted with the different First Peoples who share this land with us.

June 21 was declared **National Indigenous Peoples Day** in 1996 by then Governor General Romeo Leblanc. The day was chosen in consultation with some national organizations for Indigenous Peoples including the Assembly of First Nations, and coincides with the summer solstice which is significant for some First Nations.

Friday June 2, 2023 is a PA day for Elementary students in YRDSB. There are no classes on this day for students.

FRIDAY JUNE 30, 2023 IS AN EARLY RELEASE DAY

On Friday June 30, 2023 an early release day will take place to allow elementary teachers and support staff to take part in meetings during the afternoon of that day. These meetings will allow for school staff to engage in culminating activities regarding the review and revision of the School's Improvement Plan as well as year-end and transition activities that support student success. **Students will attend school during the morning of Friday, June 30 only. Students will be dismissed early that day** at 11:45 AM. Arrangements will be made to ensure that students who are normally bused to and from school will receive transportation at this time.

Help! There is school inventory in your homes!

Please ensure **all items belonging to the school**, Chromebooks, textbooks, library books, classroom books etc.. have been returned to the school.

ALLERGY AWARE @ EMPS!

We are reaching out to remind you that a student or students in your child's class have potentially life-threatening allergies. They have reactions that can be triggered by peanuts and tree nuts or by eggs and dairy. The medical term for this anaphylaxis.

Students with anaphylaxis are aware of how to keep themselves safe (e.g. not eating unknown foods, carrying an epi-pen, hand-washing, eating in a separate space in the classroom). Our staff is aware of the potential risk to students and receives training for administering an epi-pen. Unfortunately, we are not able to check all snacks and lunches to ensure they are safe to eat in the classroom.

We ask that all families and children do their part to help their allergic classmates stay safe. We can reduce the risk of accidental exposure with your help. Please:

- DO NOT send peanut/tree-nut containing products to school
- remind your child that food in their snack or lunch is not to be shared
- do not send food to school for sharing with classmates (e.g. birthday or other celebrations)

Your cooperation and understanding of this matter is greatly appreciated.
