Peanut and Tree Nut Free Zone! EMPS is an Allergy-Aware School!



To protect students with allergies, please help to ensure that lunches and snacks are free of nut and peanut products, and/or other allergens that may be a problem for students with allergies. We ask families and children to do their part to ensure our students with allergies stay safe. We can reduce the risk of accidental exposure with your help. Please:

- <u>DO NOT</u> send peanut/tree-nut containing products to school. This includes products like peanut butter, hazelnut/chocolate spread and their substitutes.
- Please read all labels of processed foods to ensure they indicate they are peanut/nut free.
- Remind your child that food in their snack or lunch is not to be shared.
- Do not send food to school for sharing with classmates (e.g. birthday or other celebrations).

IMPORTANT REMINDERS to Families who use School Bus Transportation:

• <u>Bus Delays:</u> We have reached out to Transportation Services for support with the ongoing bus delays with both morning and afternoon routes. We have been advised that these delays are being experienced across the region with all carriers. The operators are doing their best to cover the routes. We ask for your patience as things are expected to improve.



• Late Buses:

- It is the parent/guardian responsibility to check notifications for late buses for both the morning and afternoon bus run.

- For afternoon bus routes, if the school receives advance notification that a bus will be running late by more than 30 minutes, the office will make an effort to send an email notification to families; unfortunately we cannot guarantee this communication due to staffing or technical issues that may arise.

October is Isalmic Heritage Month:

In 2007, the Government of Canada declared the month of October as <u>Canadian Islamic History Month</u>. The province of Ontario passed the <u>Islamic</u> <u>Heritage Month Act (2016)</u> to recognize and affirm the important contributions that Muslims make in Ontario as part of the vibrant social, economic, political and cultural fabric of our province. Families are encouraged to explore IHM events and learning opportunities being hosted by various Muslim communities and organizations, with the understanding that these events are community-based. For example:

- the Ahmadiyya Muslim Jama'at, one of many Muslim communities in York Region, has invited YRDSB educators and students to participate in a virtual event on Friday, October 7th to learn how Muslims greatly contributed to the Science of Engineering
- an in-person exhibition on a wide variety of aspects of the Golden Islamic Scientific Era will be held on Friday, October 21st at the Tahir Hall Community Centre. - Make informed decisions and contributing fully to their own lives and to today's competitive global community
- Adapt to changes and synthesizing new ideas
- Work both independently and collaboratively to creatively approach challenges
- Communicate effectively





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• Think critically and creatively and see connections to other disciplines beyond mathematics (<u>Mathematics Curriculum Context</u>)

TVO Resources for Students and Families:

In support of Ontario's families this school year, TVO has assembled free K-12 learning resources and tools to complement in-class learning or to be used on their own by students and families that are curriculum based, free digital learning resources.



<u>TVO Kids</u> is specific to preschool and school age from Kindergarten to Grade 5 with programming and games to get them ready for school and learning.

<u>TVO Learn</u> has expanded to include new adult-guided Learning Activities for Grades 1 through 12 mathematics, language, science and technology and social studies.

<u>TVO Learn mPower</u> offers 65+ free games to support students in Kindergarten to Grade 6 to develop fundamental Math skills through math and STEM games.

<u>TVO Learn Mathify</u> offers free, 1:1 math tutoring with Ontario Certified Teachers for Grades 4 to 12. Now available 7 days a week, Monday to Friday, 9:00 am to 9:00 pm ET, and Saturday and Sunday, 3:00 pm to 9:00 pm ET.

TVO Today has articles, videos of stories, current affairs, documentaries and podcasts.

High school students in Ontario can access 144 courses developed by Ontario Certified Teachers. These not-for-credit courses are designed for independent study or study support.
