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

Fall Fun and Halloween Costumes @ EMPS - Tuesday, October 31st, 2023:

Students are invited to wear **Fall colours (black, orange, red, browns etc...) or our School Colours/clothing** on Tuesday, October 31st. For students who celebrate Halloween, if they wish to come to school on Tuesday, October 31st in costume, they are invited to do so.

When planning costumes, please keep the following in mind:

- that **no replica weapons** of any kind are allowed
- costumes should be respectful of others
 - symbols or objects representative of a person's culture or religious beliefs should not be worn as a costume nor should costumes that caricature social identities through stereotyping
 - o in the spirit of Truth and Reconciliation, it is important that costumes do not trivialize and devalue the lives of Indigenous peoples in Canada
- costumes should not should not overemphasize the scary aspects
- No Halloween masks are to be worn and students should only use single use make-up (no sharing of make-up).
- Costumes should be of simple design (to limit personal items being brought to school)
- Please **do not** send your child to school with or in:
 - A long or restrictive costume (these can lead to trips and falls)
 - o An inflatable costume
 - A costume that requires adult assistance to take on/off
 - Any items to share with others (candy, treats, food, toys, gift items, etc.)

Students must be able to wear their running shoes and outdoor clothing as per usual

 services are open to all regardless of age, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity,
 family makeup, social status, income, ability, physical and mental health, and religion.
- Khalil Center is a psychological and spiritual community wellness center advancing the
 professional practice of psychology rooted in Islamic principles. Khalil Center utilizes
 faith-based approaches rooted in Islamic theological concepts while integrating the science of
 psychology towards addressing psychological, spiritual and communal health
- <u>Victim Services of York Region</u> provides crisis counselling and referrals for longer-term support. Advice and support for families and educators on best practices for providing support can be found here.
- <u>Kids Help Phone</u> provides support for children and youth. Professional counsellors are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

School Bus Transportation:

- When concerns or questions arise about school bus transportation such as late pick up times, questions about bus routes, and others, you may email them to the school at elders.mills.ps@yrdsb.ca. The school office team will forward the email to Student Transportation Services. We recognize the concern families have, particularly around late pick up and drop off times and transportation services are doing the best they can with the resources available to respond to needs.
- Please note that when a school bus arrives at school past 8:45 a.m., students disembarking
 from the bus are not marked late on the attendance. We appreciate your inquiries and your
 patience and will continue to share them with Transportation Services as they come forward.
