- understanding and communicating with members of the community about the roles and responsibilities of school councils

All attendees at meetings should have an opportunity to have input into the discussions of the council but responsibility for making decisions is up to the duly elected council members who represent the entire school community.

It should also be noted that voting on controversial issues is seldom the best approach. Reaching a consensus that all members can support is often the better way to handle matters of this nature.


