School Updates

- 2. School clubs have been busy- Holiday concert, chess club, volleyball just finished, calm and cozy club, basketball has started, student council, indigenous leadership teams.
- 3. School Improvement Plan- Took a tour of the SIP board outside of the gym. What is our work over the next 5 years? What are the students' strengths? What do we need to work on? It is a work in progress and being updated. Goals will be in equity and inclusivity, mental health and wellbeing, and instruction and assessment.
 - a. Asking parents to spread awareness of the SIP board with other parents as we would like their feedback on the planning.
- 4. Gathering/Town hall We are planning on hosting a town hall to explore how parent, family and community voice could support school improvement in community relations.
 - a. March 1st is our information session to explain the process and what is being asked of everyone.
 - b. May 3rd is the tentative date for the town hall meeting.

- 5. Parents Reaching Out Grant (PRO)- No deadline. \$800 to spend on the program. Goal is community engagement.
 - a. Last year we had 3 wellbeing sessions, the new math curriculum session and financial literacy session.
