INTERIM MARK & INTERVIEW NIGHT:

In semester one, families will receive three reports including the Interim Report, Mid-Semester Report and Semester End Report. Our reports provide you information about your child's achievement throughout the first semester.

Interim reports are part of the ongoing communication from our school to support student achievement and well-being. We hope that this report will provide valuable feedback for your child while supporting conversations about learning at home. Distribution of your child's interim report card for the first semester will begin on October 19, 2022. These reports will be distributed using the same process used for Mid-Semester and Final Reports via student GAPPS accounts.

Interview Night is Thursday, October 27, 2022 from 6:00 - 7:00 p.m. Information on how to book time for an interview with a teacher will be provided at a later date.

GAPPS PROFILE IMAGES

Between October 11-14, 2022, students may customize their YRDSB Google Apps (GAPPS) profile pictures within parameters established by the YRDSB. This will enable students to express or represent themselves in their profile images, while prioritizing safe and inclusive learning and working environments for all of our students and staff.

What does this mean for my child?

- Students will have an opportunity to select a customized profile picture that meets YRDSB guidelines.
- Students will receive guidelines and considerations based on their grade level to support them in selecting and/or creating an appropriate profile picture.
- This is optional. Students who do not select an image will continue to have their first initial as their GAPPS profile image.
- Students will have two opportunities each year, during the fall and again in the spring, to change their images.

YRDSB does not tolerate any forms of hate or discrimination. In the past, it came to the Board's attention that YRDSB Google Apps (GAPPS) profile pictures were being used to spread online hate through racist imagery shared and uploaded to GAPPS accounts. These images cause pain and can make other students and staff members feel unsafe, marginalized and unwelcome in our learning environments.

Appropriate actions were taken to address this issue, including a mandatory learning series for all students, mandatory training for all YRDSB staff, and temporarily removing access to customizing profile images. YRDSB will be continuing to implement measures that support student safety over the course of this school year. These measures include providing teachers with ongoing access to resources and support for addressing issues of hate.

Students are also encouraged to report problematic images that perpetuate hate or cause harm by speaking with a caring adult or by making use of the YRDSB's ReportIT tool. More information about GAPPS profile images is <u>available on the Board website</u>.

RENEWED COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY

As part of a partnership between YRDSB and Renewed Computer Technology (RCT), families with children enrolled in our Board have the opportunity to purchase quality refurbished computers at a reduced cost. Applicants must live in Ontario, have a student enrolled at the school and either receive government assistance payments or qualify as a limited income earner under the limited income cut-off standards*.

This year, there are different packages available for purchase. Please reference the RCT flyer for the current available package offerings. Please note that there are three options for delivery.

- 1. If you would like for the computer to be delivered directly to your home, there is a \$40 charge for laptops and a \$50 charge for desktops. Families who choose this delivery option will have their order shipped when it is ready, roughly 3 weeks from date of order.
- 2. If you would like the device shipped to your child's school there is a \$20 delivery charge. If you choose this shipping option, the computer will be delivered to your child's school after the end of the promotion period. 

REFERENCE: After-School Programs (Gr 7-12)

Funding for After-School Programming is available to support students requiring literacy and/or numeracy remediation. Based on feedback from staff we have updated the school processes to access this funding support.

Program Requirements:

- principal recommendation is required for all students enrolling in the program;
- the minimum number of students required to run the program is 12;
- programs may run at any point during the school year (October May);
- schools may run concurrent programs and/or multiple programs over the school year;
- programs for elementary schools are required to run a minimum of 10 hours; and,
- programs for secondary schools are required to run a minimum of 15 hours.

School Process:

- school administration will identify and hire the program teacher;
- an After-School Programming Request must be completed for each class being offered;
- once the program request has been submitted, Continuing Education Services (CES) will share an attendance sheet with the program teacher and the school administrator contact;
- the program attendance sheet must be maintained throughout the course of the program; and,
- upon completion of the program, schools will notify asp@yrdsb.ca.

International Student Costs

A non-residential fee of \$108 (secondary) or \$72 (elementary) will apply to International Students for each program, funds should be transferred to budget number 070240 5 846 502, this fee cannot be waived.

Teacher Compensation and Coverage:

CES will complete the Teacher Acceptance of Permission form after the program has concluded and the student attendance sheet and international student costs are verified. Teachers will be compensated at the CES teacher hourly rate and paid in a lump sum.
