Dear Families,

In this edition we will focus on celebrating neurodiversity within our student population. We recognize [Autism Acceptance day](#) through highlighting strengths, characteristics, resources, and celebrating the spectrum; we want to acknowledge that families are the core support. There are many ways of thinking, learning or acting and we know that the uniqueness between us as people is to be celebrated and acknowledged. This year, we are moving to increasing acceptance.



For families who are looking to increase their understanding in supporting Autistic people, [Kerry's place](#) offers a great [Resource Portal](#) where there are [videos](#) and [handouts](#) with helpful information to expand understanding of Autism. [Kinark Autism Services](#) has created a [spring guide](#) for services available from April to June 2023 for families connected to the [Ontario Autism Program](#) for free. They also have free [Parent & Caregiver Education](#) that is available to all families.

[Autism Ontario](#) provides informational resources about the intersection between Mental health and Autism. They share how Autistic youth who also experience [Anxiety](#) may find sensory support or art therapy helpful. Sensory calming

techniques may include a fidget object, or making sure to have noise cancelling headphones accessible. Art therapy can help many people share feelings in a creative way- this can look like painting or picking up a musical instrument!

It is important to acknowledge the diversity in experience and characteristics of Autistic youth, and learn alongside while solving problems, coping with challenges and expressing joy. When we talk about Autistic youth, it is important to note the [identity first language](#) used as this is preferred by most Autistic people. We do encourage people to check in with each person to see what language fits best for them.

Emily Carr Secondary School Prom Package 2023

Dear parent/Guardian:

Emily Carr Secondary School is pleased to announce that we will be celebrating the 2023 Prom with our graduating students on **Thursday, June 8th, 2023** at The Terrace Banquet Centre in Vaughan. The evening will begin at 5:45 p.m. and end at 9:45 p.m. The evening events will include a dinner followed by a dance. Thanks to the efforts of the organizing committee comprised of students and teachers, Prom has become a wonderful celebration and successful tradition.

Please note that the administration and staff of Emily Carr Secondary School has not organized, nor does it sanction, any before or after Prom activities or events. Activities and events held before or after the prom, including all transportation arrangements, have been externally organized. School staff has not been involved in the planning and will not be supervising or participating in these before or after Prom events.

As the Prom is a school sponsored event, the school's Code of Conduct, Caring and Safe Schools policy and all school rules and procedures are in effect during the Prom. The use and/or possession of alcohol or illegal substances are not permitted at York Region District School Board events. Supervision at the Prom will be provided by volunteering school staff. In addition, security will also be on duty throughout the night.

It is strongly recommended by the school that parents/guardians review the attached Prom package with their child before making a determination on attendance. This review should include before and after activities, consumption of alcohol and/or illegal substances, transportation to and from the event and, appropriate behaviour.

Note:

- **As a reminder, parent/guardians of students under 18 and students over 18 are responsible to review and adhere to the COVID-19 and Child-Care Screening Tool in the days prior to the event**
- **The acknowledgement of the Prom Letter of Understanding MUST be signed and returned before Friday, May 5th, 2023 as well as payment for admission**
- **All admission costs are non-refundable and admission costs are non-transferable**
- **All students must be picked up by 10:00 p.m.**

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Letter of Understanding

Times

- Doors open at 5:45 PM
- Dinner will begin promptly at 7:00 PM
- Doors will close at 7:00 PM - **No one will be admitted after 7:00 PM**
- The Prom will end at 9:45 pm. All students must be picked up by 10:00 p.m.

Please Note

- **Emily Carr Secondary School does not endorse any before or after Prom parties.**
- **The “Good Night Rule” will be in effect. You will not be allowed to re-enter the Prom if you leave for any reason. Bring everything in with you when you enter.**
- **Admission costs are NON-REFUNDABLE and only valid for original purchaser of the admission (and original guest).**

Who May Attend and Admission Price

- Only students from ECSS may purchase admission. Students from ECSS are able to invite a guest. If you are inviting a guest, please read the guest section.
- Prom admission price: \$92.70 per person
- Admission must be purchased before the PROM. Admission to the Prom will not be sold at the door.
- **ECSS students will ONLY be admitted with E.C.S.S. photo identification AND proof of admission payment!**
- **Guests will ONLY be admitted with required photo identification AND proof of admission payment!**
- Students who are serving a suspension may not attend PROM, including their guest.

Student Attendance at school on Thursday, June 8th and Friday, June 9th

- Students who attend the Prom are expected to attend classes on Thursday, June 8th and Friday, June 9th.
- Absences the day of the Prom and the day following a school dance are not legitimate and parents must ensure students can balance going to the Prom and attending classes the day of the Prom and the following day.

Guests

- Registration of guests will be accepted prior to purchasing admission. Guests must read, sign and submit the “Emily Carr Secondary School Guest Application Form” prior to having their admission purchased.
- The supervising administrator has the right to refuse admittance to any person. All guests will be screened by the administration to determine attendance at Prom.



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- An E.C.S.S. student may sign for **one** guest only.
- When arriving at Prom, guests **must be signed in and accompanied by their host student**. The host student is responsible for the guest at Prom. Names, at time of purchase of admission, must be the same as on day of Prom. Admission that has been purchased is not transferable.
- Photo identification or a student card is required from the guest. Acceptable forms of photo identification include: student identification, driver's licence, health card, or passport. **All guests must provide one of these forms of photo identification upon arrival at the Prom.**
- Invited guests may not be older than 21 years of age.

Chaperones and Security

- E.C.S.S. staff will act as chaperones.
- Security shall be hired to enforce the Prom expectations.
- All coat must be checked in the coat check area provided.
- For safety and security, students will be asked to display contents of purses, bags, pockets and jackets.
- Access to adjacent banquet halls is not permitted.

Dress Code

- It is expected that all students will adhere to E.C.S.S.'s school policies.

Smoking and Vaping

- Smoking is not permitted inside the facility.
- Vaping is not permitted inside the facility.
- Students who leave the facility will not be allowed to re-enter.

Food and Refreshments

- The provided refreshments are to be consumed in the designated area only.

E.C.S.S. CODE OF CONDUCT

E.C.S.S. promotes responsibility, respect, civility, and academic excellence in a safe learning and teaching environment. All members of the school community have the right to be and feel safe. With this right comes the responsibility to be law-abiding citizens and to be accountable for actions that put at risk the safety of others or oneself. All members of the school community are to be treated with respect and dignity. The Code of Conduct applies to all members of the school community whether they are on school property, neighbouring properties, on school buses, or at school-authorized events or activities. Students must show respect for the Prom facility.



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Discipline

- The school code of conduct and safe school policy are in effect.
- Use/possession of harmful and/or illegal substances such as alcohol and drugs will result in removal from the Prom, suspension from school and may also result in criminal prosecution.
- Any student or guest arriving at a dance under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol will be refused admission and referred to the administration.
- Any serious breaches in student conduct will be reported to the administration.
- Students and/or guests who are removed from the Prom will not have their admission cost refunded.
- If a student host is removed from the Prom, their guest will also be asked to leave

Expectations

Students are to be treated with respect and dignity. In return, they demonstrate respect for themselves, for others and for the responsibilities of citizenship through acceptable behaviour. Respect and responsibility are demonstrated when a student shows respect for themselves, for others and for those in authority; refrains from bringing anything to school events that may compromise the safety of others; follows the rules, and takes responsibility for their own action. Members of the school community have a responsibility to maintain an environment where conflict and difference can be addressed in a manner characterized by respect and civility. Students will be expected to observe and be accountable to the Ontario Safe Schools Policy and the York Region District School Board Caring and Safe Schools Policy.

Improving Student Behaviour (from E.C.S.S. Student Handbook)

Improving student behaviour will include such things as counseling, detentions, written explanations, parent contact, student contract, peer mediation, restorative practice, withdrawal of privileges, confiscation of inappropriate items, referral for assistance, police intervention, restitution, suspension from school and/or expulsion.

The E.C.S.S. Code of Conduct is based on the "Ontario Schools: Code of Conduct" and regulation 298, Section 23 from The Ontario Education Act.
