

#### **EMILY CARR AFTER SCHOOL WALK-IN COVID-19 VACCINATION CLINIC**

Emily Carr will be hosting a Covid-19 Vaccination clinic on Thursday, September 16 from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Children and youth born in 2009 and earlier are eligible to be vaccinated. No appointment is required.

#### DAILY SELF SCREENING FOR COVID-19 AND PROCESS FOR SCHOOL ENTRY

Students will have to perform their COVID-19 self screening daily, as outlined below.

Step 1: Everyday, students must complete the on-line self-assessment COVID-19 School and Child-Care Screening Tool before entering the school. You will get one of these responses to your screening, here is what you do...

If you get a 'Go to school' response:

Go to school/child care

If you get a 'Do not go to school' response:

Do not go to school/child care

Complete this YRDSB Confirmation Step 2: Form.

Step 3: Upon completion of the YRDSB Confirmation form, students will receive an email. This email is colour coded by the day of the week, to help our school staff easily identify that students have successfully self-screened.

Step 4: Students will show their colour-coded email response in one of the Step 2: You cannot go to school. Follow the directions provided by the self-screening tool.

#### **CITY OF VAUGHAN: SPEED LIMIT**

In June 2021, the City of Vaughan approved the creation of a new Speed Limit Policy to ensure the safety of all road users and address road safety concerns noted by residents and city staff.

As part of the City's MoveSmart Mobility Management Strategy approved in March 2021, the policy will be used as a speed management tool to set and adjust appropriate speed limits throughout the City's street network.

Under this new policy, speed limit changes, including installation of new signage, are anticipated to be completed in school zones by Sept. 8, 2021, public laneways in spring 2022 and select neighbourhood areas in fall 2022.

Within the first phase of the policy, speed limits in school zones will be reduced from 50km/h to 40 km/h. The Policy is designed to increase comfort and safety for all users, encourage active forms of mobility, and create healthier communities.

After an extended hiatus of in-school learning due to COVID-19, it is more important than ever to remind pedestrians, drivers and cyclists of the rules of the road.

The city has installed mobile signs around the city to bring awareness to this new policy and is asking schools to remind their students and families to be vigilant when driving or using active transportation in their neighbourhood. For more information please click <a href="here">here</a>.
