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# LEADERS IN EQUITY AND DIVERSITY (LEAD)

As part of our equity and inclusion journey at ECSS we are excited and proud to announce that we will have the Pride Flag displayed within our school. The flag is a symbol of acceptance that works in many languages. Also, each color in the flag has a universal meaning: red for life, orange for healing, yellow for sunlight, green for nature, blue for harmony and purple for spirit. We are committed to ensuring an equitable and inclusive learning and working environments that uphold and reflect the Seven Guiding Principles of Ontario's Equity and Inclusive Education Strategy.

We recognize the diversity within our 2SLGBTQ+ communities and acknowledge the presence of indigenous, racialized, disabled and other diverse identities. Unfortunately, we see examples of bullying, hate propaganda, cyber bullying, homophobia, transphobia, racism and other expressions of discrimination in our society which can sometimes spill over into our schools. As indicated in the Equity Strategy, such behaviours "can lead to students feeling rejected, excluded and isolated at school, which may result in behavioural problems in the classroom, decreased interest in school, lower levels of achievement and higher dropout rates."

Displaying the Pride Flag demonstrates our commitment to eliminating harmful biases and prejudice that lead to discrimination and exclusion. It signals our commitment to upholding the principles outlined in the Ontario Human Rights Code and the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms which reflect the values held by Canadians and Ontarians. In addition, the Pride Flag is in alignment with the Board's Improvement Plan for Student Achievement which identifies Indigenous Education and Equity as one of the four focus areas.

We acknowledge that everyone – government, staff, students, parents and members of the wider community – has an important role to play in creating learning and working environments which are respectful, safer and inclusive.

Students are required to review their IPP at least twice per year. The IPP is part of the ministry document,* <u>Creating Pathways to Success</u>, which is designed to help students achieve their personal goals and become competent, successful, and contributing members of society.
