Extended Absence – Family Vacation

Students have the responsibility to attend school and to ensure the continuity of their learning. Emily Carr Secondary School students who are withdrawn from school for a family vacation during the school year do so with the full understanding that they are responsible for the course work covered during their absence. Absence from school has a direct effect upon students' learning and subsequent evaluation. In some cases it may not be possible to 'make up' missed learning, and teachers may not be able to accommodate students who have been withdrawn from class.

Families who are planning to withdraw students from school for a family vacation are asked to pick up an Extended Absence Form from the main office. This includes vacations where the student will be missing school at the beginning of the school year. This form is completed by teachers, signed by parents, and returned to the main office prior to the extended absence.

Please note that if a student is withdrawn from school for a family vacation without notifying the Principal, or, if the duration of absence is more than 15 school days, the student may need to re-register for admission to ECSS or may be required to attend school at an alternate location if space is not available at ECSS.

Safe, Caring and Supportive Schools:

Our Student Code of Conduct (page 6 of the ECSS "School Start-Up Package") and underthe Caring and Supportive Schools (pages 56 to 61 of the Board's "Guide to the 2014-2015 School Year"). Please read and review both with your child. Once completed, let your child know that both parents/guardians and students are required to sign a form showing that they have read and understand the policies. Students will take the form home and should have their parent/guardian sign it and return it to their homeroom teacher by **Wednesday, September 10th.** Every student is required to return a signed form.

Photograph/Video Images of Students

Students and parents are asked to be aware that at various times during the school year student images may be captured and shared for educational purposes. Examples include (not a complete list):

- yearbook photos
- student projects (ie. videos created by students for presentations)
- team/club photos and videos
- photos/videos taken by students in photography/communication technology classes
- student celebrations (ie. academic awards)

APPLYING TO A CONTINUING EDUCATION COURSE | STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS

YRDSB Night School, YRDSB e-Learning Night School, YRDSB Day E-Learning and YCDSB Night School

YRDSB Night School Registration, Fall 2014

York Region day school students will use the Career Cruising Course Planner to register for courses offered at Night School. Night School will be offered at Dr. Bette Stephenson Centre for Learning. To apply for courses, we strongly recommend that you take care of all steps in the process by **September 14th**.

- 1. Go to <u>www.yrdsb.edu.on.ca</u> and click on the Career Cruising logo.
- Login in by entering your username (yorkXXXXXXX where XXXXXXXX is your 9-digit student number) and password (your birthday in this format - mmddyyyy). If you have already created a new password for yourself this year, use your new password. You will be prompted to create one if this is your first entry for this year.
- 3. To register for the Night School course you wish to take, click on *CHOOSE MY COURSES* from the list of options in the menu on the left hand side of the screen.
- 4. Click on "+ add course" in the CON ED box that appears in your Course Planner.
- 5. Choose the CONTINUING EDUCATION TYPE from the drop down menu: (Night School Fall)
- 6. Using the drop down menu under *DISCIPLINE*, find the subject area that the course you wish to take is in and click on it. All of the courses in that subject area, which are being offered at the school, will appear in a list. Find the <u>correct course</u> and select the course by clicking in the bubble to the far left of the course.
- 7. Click on UPDATE PLANNER.
- 8. Click *PRINT under the CON ED* box. The print copy of your Continuing Education registration will appear. Click the "Print this Document" button in the top right corner to print.
- 9. Have your Parent or Guardian sign the printed copy. Hand in the printed copy to Mrs. Genova in the Guidance and Career Education Office for verification. This is a very important step without which we cannot electronically verify your application. The board has notified us that by September 16th, any non-verified applications will have to be considered cancelled.

- 10. Should the course you apply for be cancelled, you will be contacted by the Continuing Education staff on September 16th. Please ensure that the contact information you provide is correct.
- 11. Classes are on Tuesday's and Thursday's beginning on **September 18th** at 6:30 9:45 p.m.

YRDSB e-Learning Night School, Fall 2014

Registration for e-Learning night school will begin September 8th. Visit <u>http://www.coned.elearning.yrdsb.ca/</u>

for further information and to apply. Students are required to meet with their guidance counsellor to verify all applications. The final step in the application process is for your counsellor to email the e-Learning Schoo to confirm your qualifications for the course you select.

YRDSB Day e-Learning, Semester 1

ECSS students may take an e-Learning course as a 4th or 5th credit. Unlike e-Learning Night School courses, for a Day e-Learning course, attendance is taken daily. Hence, students are required to sign in each school day any time before midnight from any computer. Pick up a Day e-Learning Course Request Form from the Guidance office. Courses begin September 2. Submit your request as early as possible.

YCDSB Night School Registration, Fall 2014

The closest YCDSB site this year will be: **St. Jean de Brebeuf**. Online registration has begun. ECSS students should follow

the steps below, print, complete, sign and submit the form to your guidance office. We will forward your application form for you if we receive it by 3:00pm on September 15th, 2014.

- 1. Under the tab "Secondary Credits" click on "Non YCDSB Students".
- 2. Follow the steps as outlined on the form.
- 3. Print the Registration Form (External Student).
- 4. Have the registration form signed by your parent/guardian.
- 5. Give the form to Mrs. Genova in the Guidance office as early as possible and absolutely no later than September 10. Even though the registration deadline is posted for a later date, external students such as you have to have this form forwarded by us and this takes time.
- 6. Classes at YCDSB St. Jean de Brebeuf begin on September 23rd from 6:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m.

We will forward your form to YCDSB if we receive it by September 15th, 2014.



native-like fluency or have studied the language through the International Languages Program (SK-8).


Students will be responsible for purchasing the course textbook/course packs which will be sold in September. Students must have the required prerequisite.
