



BLACK GRADUATION COACH

We are pleased to announce the launch of the Black Students' Graduation Coach Initiative. This Ontario Ministry of Education funded initiative is designed to support the wellbeing and success of Black students in the province, including Black students attending York Region District schools. While Black students have graduated from York Region District schools, the purpose of the Graduation Coach Program for Black Students is to help determine if providing intensive, culturally-responsive support to Black students who are at risk of not graduating will help improve their academic achievement and well-being. Evidence shows that outcomes for Black students are significantly lower than their peers across multiple service system sectors, including education, health, and employment. Research studies find that systemic racism and discrimination are root causes for these outcomes (James & Turner, 2017). ECSS is one of the YRDSB sites where the program will run. Coaches will support Black students by:

- Acting as mentor and advisor to the students;
- Regularly meets and collaborates with 'Circle of Caring Adults' including administrators teachers, parents/guardians/families, and the broader community in responding to individual and systemic barriers;
- Identifying and addressing individual barriers to engagement; and,
- Facilitating access and referrals to academic supports and community resources to provide an integrated support system for the students.

Access to this program is via referral or in-school activities associated with the program.

ISLAMIC HERITAGE CELEBRATION 2020

The Alliance of Educators for Muslim Students invites students to participate in workshops that center student voice and experience. 
