#### School News

#### **Winter Weather**

With the arrival of winter weather, we wanted to provide some important reminders about the steps we take to keep students safe when severe weather occurs.

#### **School Transportation Cancellations**

School transportation (buses and taxis) may be cancelled due to extreme cold or inclement weather. On these days, schools will remain open unless otherwise stated. If school transportation is cancelled in the morning, it will also be cancelled in the afternoon. Any special or hot lunch days and field trips will also be cancelled.

Families should use their best judgment to decide whether to send their children to school on extreme cold or inclement weather days. Students will not be penalized for missing school on those days. For safety reasons, please ensure you let the school know if your child will not be attending school that day.

#### **School Closures**

Emergency closures will be considered when conditions may not be safe for students and staff members to attend school for the full day. This may include events that significantly limit school operations or access to the school site (e.g., widespread, prolonged power failures or downed power lines).

In keeping with our current practice, we will continue to keep our schools open as much as possible. However, it is important that families have alternate childcare arrangements planned for the rare occasions when schools may be closed. Before and aftercare programs will not operate if schools are closed.

#### **Communication to Families**

Decisions about school transportation and school closures will be made as early as possible and no later than 6:00 a.m. We will do our best to notify families in advance when we may be considering closing school and Board offices. 
#### **Good Neighbour Relationships**

The students of ECSS have a shared responsibility with our community partners to ensure an inviting and clean environment for our neighbours and our community. Students are asked to respect the property and privacy of our neighbours. Although the Al Palladini Community Center, the Pierre Berton Resource Library and the Business establishments at the Plaza are public facilities, they are to be treated as private property by our students. Students are not to loiter in, or near, these establishments. To be inside Al Palladini Community Center, students must have a Community Center membership and they must be participating in community activities. We are proud of our students as they are ECSS ambassadors wherever they go in the community.

#### **School Safety**

In the interest of safely dropping off and picking up your child and to help traffic move smoother, we ask parents not to drop their children off or stop in the wheelchair bus area. Cars stopping in the wheelchair bus area block traffic behind them causing it to be slower for everyone and our wheelchair buses are unable to drop off and/or pick-up our students in a timely manner. In addition, the lanes directly in front of the main entrance are emergency and bus lanes, please do not use these lanes to drop off or pick up your child. If you drive your child to school, you know that it can be quite busy. You can avoid the morning rush by dropping your child off before 7:45 a.m., carpooling, or encouraging your child to walk or make use of public transit.

### **Updates from Guidance**

**ONTARIO UNIVERSITY AND ONTARIO COLLEGE APPLICATION DEADLINES** are listed below. Students are encouraged to apply as soon as they have decided on their post-secondary programs.

Ontario University/OUAC applications - **NO LATER THAN MONDAY, JANUARY 15, 2024** for equal consideration.

Ontario College/OCAS applications - **NO LATER THAN THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 1, 2024** for equal consideration.

\*In addition to counsellor support, students have been provided with links to video tutorials to assist with the application process in their "All Things Grade 12" Google Classroom.

Community Involvement Hours (CIH) is a graduation requirement and all students are required to earn 40 hours to earn their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. The Winter Break is a great opportunity for students to complete these hours. Students have been informed of some opportunities via their grade google classrooms and are encouraged to reach out to not-for-profit organizations to support. 
