Spring Session for OSSLT

The Spring session for the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) will be held in the **main library** on the following dates:

- Part A: Tuesday, April 1, 2025, from 8:00 AM to 10:40 AM
- Part B: Wednesday April 2, 2025, from 8:00 AM to 10:40 AM
- Make-Up Session: Tuesday, April 8, 2025, from 8:00 AM to 10:40 AM

This session is for students who were not yet successful in the Fall window of the OSSLT. Students and families will receive notification letters in the coming weeks with details about the specific testing dates. Students have been directed to come straight to the main library for 8:00 am on both dates of the test. Attendance will be taken in the library.

Family Interview Night will take place on **Thursday, April 3** at **Emily Carr Secondary School** from **6:00 PM to 8:00 PM**. Come and meet your child's teachers and the other caring adults who make Emily Carr Secondary School such a special place.

Dear Families,

The Ontario Ministry of Education released <u>Policy/Program</u> <u>Memorandum 128</u> in the fall of 2024, which included a directive to school boards to set out enforcement mechanisms to address the possession, use and provision of tobacco, electronic cigarettes, nicotine products, recreational cannabis, alcohol and illegal drugs. In support of a comprehensive approach, we are pleased to announce that in the coming months, vape-detecting devices will be installed at all YRDSB secondary schools.
