Message from Administration:

As we transition into the warmer months, we'd like to remind families of the importance of encouraging safe, healthy choices among our students. With increased outdoor activities and more relaxed routines, this is an ideal time to revisit important conversations at home.

One area of continued concern is **vaping**. Despite ongoing efforts, we are still seeing incidents of vaping on school property. We want to be clear: **vaping is strictly prohibited on school grounds**. In alignment with Ministry guidelines, vape detectors have been installed in school washrooms. Students found vaping or tampering with these devices will face serious consequences, which may include suspension and other progressive discipline measures.

We ask families to speak openly with their children about the health risks of vaping, the importance of attending class regularly, and making responsible decisions—particularly during the temptations that often come with spring and summer.

Additional Updates:

- School Construction Has Begun: Please plan ahead for possible disruptions to regular routines.
- Drop-Off and Pick-Up Adjustments: During construction, we ask that families use the front loop.
- Alternative Drop-Off Locations: Students may also be dropped off at Al Pal Community Centre or Pierre Berton Library and walk safely to school from there.

Please note that our number of accepted applicants for 2025/2026 SWAT Team depends on the number of grade 9 students attending ECSS next school year. Returning SWAT Mentors are **not guaranteed** a position next year. Accepted 2025/2026 SWAT Mentors will be notified in late May. <u>Students</u> have been asked to express their interest via the application forms found in the Grade 10 and Grade 11 Google Classrooms. They have been reminded to review the expectations below **prior** to completing the application form. The application form is due no later than **Friday, May 9, 2025 by 3:00 pm.** ****LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AND THERE IS NO WAIT LIST FOR THE 2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR.

This virtual event is divided into 4 sessions, where students can learn about the universities of their choice and ask questions. This event is tailored to Grade 11 and younger students who are beginning their university research. Registration is available now.

IMPORTANT DATES / INFO. FOR OUAC:

- MAY 29, 2025 The latest date for those who submitted their application by the January application deadline can expect a response from an Ontario university. This includes: An offer of admission; a refusal; or a deferral, once additional information is received.
- JUNE 2, 2025 The earliest date an Ontario high school student may be required to respond to an
 Ontario university offer of admission and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit,
 residence deposit, etc.).
- *All other admission-related elements, including scholarships, other forms of student assistance or financial incentives, and offers of residence, are considered part of the offer of admission.
 Therefore, a student may accept these other offers before June 2, 2025, but Ontario universities will not compel a student in any way to make a decision before this date.





Target Audience:

- > Students needing 1 credit to graduate or who are otherwise credit deficient
- > Students in a Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) or Ontario Youth Apprenticeship (OYAP)
- > Students on a college pathway (i.e. in College level English, Math courses)
- Students who are uncertain about their post-secondary pathway

Please note:

- Students must be 16-years of age as of January 1, 2025 to apply
- Students who have met their graduation requirements will not be accepted.

Transportation:

- > As much as possible, students should choose a course at a college that is closest to their home school
- > Transportation will be provided: PRESTO card for YRT/TTC use, or Taxi pick-up and drop-off (depending on the travel time and distance to the college course. As per policy change at the Ministry level, more students will be expected to use public transportation. You will be contacted in mid-late June with travel arrangements.
- *Students able to get to the college on their own (driving themselves or getting a lift) should notify the Dual Credit Teacher by Email ASAP

About the Dual Credit Program:

Dual Credit courses allow Gr. 11 and 12 high school students to take college courses that count towards both the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or SHSM OSSD and a college certificate, diploma, or degree. Students may earn up to a maximum of <u>four</u> elective credits through college-delivered dual credit courses that count towards their OSSD or SHSM OSSD (e.g three in Gr.12 one in Gr.11). Some of the program's benefits include:

- ➤ Earn secondary school AND college credits simultaneously
- > Fully funded tuition and course materials at no cost to students.
- > A true college experience (campus, state-of-the-art facilities, instructor,, etc.)
- ➤ Test Drive a Future Career
- Explore different pathways options
