# School safety

In the interest of safely dropping off and picking up your child and to help traffic move smoother, we ask parents not to drop their children off or stop in the wheelchair bus area. Cars stopping in the wheelchair bus area block traffic behind them causing it to be slower for everyone and our wheelchair buses are unable to drop off and/or pick-up our students in a timely manner. In addition, the lanes directly in front of the main entrance are emergency and bus lanes, please do not use these lanes to drop off or pick up your child.

If you drive your child to school, you know that it can be quite busy. You can avoid the morning rush by dropping your child off before 7:45 a.m., carpooling, or encouraging your child to walk or make use of public transit.

# YRDSB safety week

The York Region School Board is committed to ensuring the safety of students, staff, building occupants and visitors in the event of an emergency situation. As such, during Safety Week (September 25 to 29, 2023) and throughout the school year, schools in our Board practise various safety drills including Fire Drills, Lockdown Drills, Hold and Secure Drills and the newly established Bomb Threat Drill. It is critical that all members of our school community become familiar with emergency protocols as they are designed to keep all of us safe at school. Secondary school students can complete the secondary school student form at<u>https://startupforms.yrdsb.ca/students</u>. They will also receive the link in their student GAPPS account. Elementary school students **do not** need to complete these student forms.

Please note:

• You **must be signed in to your child's student GAPPS account** to complete the form. Please remember to sign out of one account before signing into another. Additional information is available on the Board website on <u>how to login to the student</u> <u>account to complete the forms</u>.

 $\cdot$  If you prefer to complete the forms on paper or have questions about the information in the forms, please contact the school office.

• Parents/guardians must complete a separate form for each child attending school. Please ensure you log out of one student account before logging into another. You will not be able to submit the form twice logged into the same student account.

# A Message from the Student Services (Special Education) Department

The Student Services Department would like to welcome everyone to the 2023-24 school year! We hope your child(ren) had a great first week at school.

- We are in the process of assigning a SERT to each student in the department. This process should be completed this week. Once completed, SERTs will reach out to students by email to let them know who they are, and will meet with them face-to-face over the coming weeks. You will also receive an email from the SERT introducing themselves.
- Your child's SERT will be creating their IEP. IEPs are updated every year. New IEPs will be distributed by Oct. 18th. You will receive an IEP Consultation Form in your SERT introduction email, should you wish to provide input to your child's IEP.
- 3. Your child's SERT should be their (and your) main point of contact, however your child may be supported by other SERTs in the department (ex; in class, in the resource room). Should your child require anything outside of their regular support, they should reach out to their SERT for assistance (by email or phone or by booking an appointment with them).

We recognize that not all families will have children that have been identified as requiring special education support. We want to ensure that we do not miss any families who are new to Special Education or may be in the process of accessing support.

Students in grades 9-12 will be invited in the next day or so to grade specific classrooms. This is where important school information will be posted by the Main Office, Student Council, Guidance, Coop, the Leadership class, and many other school groups.
