#### **Black History Month Celebration**

On February 27, 2025, local, award-winning band Glenn Marais & the Mojo Train will be joining us for our Black History Month Assembly.

Glenn and his band are dedicated to "giving back to their community and currently run their own non-profit, MusicCan, that provides instruments and lessons to underserved youth in Canada and are currently sponsoring music programs in two YRDSB schools with plans to expand. The band's motto is Give to Live and over the years they have continually supported the Food Bank, Starlight Children's Foundation, Blue Door Shelters and have raised over 100 000 for The Stephen Lewis Foundation.

The band is comprised of Juno-nominated songwriter Glenn Marais on guitar and vocals, bassist Manny De Grandis-leader of the Maples, The Toronto Blues Society House Band, keyboardist Jesse Karwat, keyboardist for Canadian Rock Legends, I Mother Earth, and renowned drummer Jeff Saulnier".

The band is currently in Memphis, Tennessee, competing in the semi-finals of the International Blues Challenge.

At Emily Carr, Glenn Marais & the Mojo Train will be performing their Keynote Concert, Black History: the Music and the Message, which is described as "a riveting and powerful musical and visual journey through Black History that teaches, inspires, and challenges audiences to reflect, learn, and grow from the lessons of the past". Glenn and his band will also be taking time to meet and converse with Carr's BSA.

#### **Updates from Guidance**

COURSE SELECTIONS FOR THE 2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR are NOW OPEN in myBlueprint (MyPathwayPlanner) and will close on Friday, February 21st, 4:00p.m. Long weekends are a great time for families to review, research, and submit options. Please see some key points below to assist in your conversations with your child/student:

- Students participated in a Course Selection Assembly and the ECSS Course Offerings Fair. Information has been posted in each Grade Google Classroom.
- This is not a "first come, first served" process as long as students make their selections prior to the **Friday**, **February 21st, 4:00 p.m.** deadline, all requests are treated equally.
- Please note that course selections are not complete/locked in until parent/guardian has approved selections via email (email comes from myBlueprint parents/guardians should check junk mail folder if they cannot find the email).

Parents/guardians are asked to have their students (who have applied to postsecondary programs at colleges or universities in Ontario) **check their OCAS and/or OUAC accounts** this upcoming week. ECSS has completed the upload for final first semester marks for all students. If students notice any mark discrepancies, or if they notice any courses that appear that should no longer be there, they are asked to contact their guidance counsellor or speak to our Guidance secretary, Mrs. Giotis.

A representative from the Toronto Metropolitan University (TMU) will be hosting a drop-in Q & A session for current and future applicants over the lunch period on Tuesday, March 18th just outside the cafeteria.

### Welcome to the YRDSB Family Dashboard

The dashboard will give you secure one-stop access to information and applications related to your child's education. It is designed to make it easier for you to engage with your child's education.

## Register today at family.yrdsb.ca.

#### Setting up your account

- 1. Visit family.yrdsb.ca.
- 2. Click "No account? Create one" under the email.
- 3. Enter the email address you have on file at your child's school, and click the Next Button.
- 4. Check your email, you will receive an email with a one-time code that expires within 30 minutes in order to confirm your identity. Enter that code on the account creation screen.

#### Once your email has been validated you will be asked to:

- 1. Create a password.
  - Passwords must be between 8-256 characters and include three of the four following types of characters: lowercase characters; uppercase characters, numbers (0-9); symbols
- 2. Enter a Display Name (your parent/guardian name).
- 3. Enter the following information about your child or one of your children for further verification:

If you use the same email address for your children's schools, all of your children will show in the dashboard once you have registered.

- a. Student Number (is the same number as their GAPPS ID, or is available in EDBSY)
- b. Student Birthdate
- c. Student Home Address Postal Code

2-Credit Co-op

#### 1-Credit Co-op

Students will participate in virtual and inperson learning with their Co-op teacher and in-person/virtual Co-op placements in their community from July 2, 2025 to July 25, 2025. Location of the in-person classes is to be determined at a later date.

Registration opens February 14, 2025 and closes on March 7, 2025.

1-Credit ALEP is available to students in grades 10-12 interested in earning a credit in July through paid employment.

Employers must meet with the summer ALEP teacher for a placement assessment before students are accepted into the program.


