School safety

In the interest of safely dropping off and picking up your child and to help traffic move smoother, we ask parents not to drop their children off or stop in the wheelchair bus area. Cars stopping in the wheelchair bus area block traffic behind them causing it to be slower for everyone and our wheelchair buses are unable to drop off and/or pick-up our students in a timely manner. In addition, the lanes directly in front of the main entrance are emergency and bus lanes, please do not use these lanes to drop off or pick up your child.

If you drive your child to school, you know that it can be quite busy. You can avoid the morning rush by dropping your child off before 7:45 a.m., carpooling, or encouraging your child to walk or make use of public transit.

Good Neighbour Relationships

The students of ECSS have a shared responsibility with our community partners to ensure an inviting and clean environment for our neighbours and our community. Students are asked to respect the property and privacy of our neighbours. Although the Al Palladini Community Center, the Pierre Berton Resource Library and the Business establishments at the Plaza are public facilities, they are to be treated as private property by our students. School start up forms

It is important that these forms are completed as soon as possible at the start of the school year as they contain important information and permissions. **The forms can be found at_https://startupforms.yrdsb.ca/.** Tips are available if you need additional information on how to log in to the Student GAPPS account to complete the forms.

Secondary school students can complete the secondary school student form at https://startupforms.yrdsb.ca/students. They will also receive the link in their student GAPPS account. Elementary school students **do not** need to complete these student forms.

Please note:

- You must be signed in to your child's student GAPPS
 account to complete the form. Please remember to sign out of
 one account before signing into another. Additional information
 is available on the Board website on how to login to the student
 account to complete the forms.
- If you prefer to complete the forms on paper or have questions about the information in the forms, please contact the school office.
- Parents/guardians must complete a separate form for each child attending school. Please ensure you log out of one student account before logging into another. You will not be able to submit the form twice logged into the same student account.

Dear Parents/Guardians and Students:

We hope this correspondence finds you and your family well.

The purpose of this email is to share:

- 1. semester 1 midterm reporting dates for all students;
- 2. full disclosure dates for all students in Grade 11 and/or Grade 12 courses; and
- 3. key dates and information for potential graduates applying to Ontario colleges and/or universities.

Semester 1 Midterm Reporting - All students

York Region District School Board will be issuing electronic copies of the Semester 1 midterm report cards between November 20-22. The electronic copy will be sent to the student's GAPPS email and instructions on how to access the report will be emailed to all families prior to their release.

Full Disclosure for Grade 11 and Grade 12 Courses

For 2023-2024, the course withdrawal date (Full Disclosure) will be 5 instructional days from the last possible date the mid-semester report is issued (i.e. November 22). The Full Disclosure date for Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses is November 29, 2023. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course on or prior to November 29, 2023, then the course will not be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course after the Full Disclosure date, a withdrawal (W) is entered in the credit column, and the student's mark at the time of withdrawal will be recorded as a percentage in the achievement column of the transcript.

OUAC and OCAS Upload for Potential Graduates

Identifying information will be shared through a secure transmission to the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) and the Ontario College Application Service (OCAS) to support students with their application to post-secondary institutions. Potential graduates who are not planning to apply to an Ontario college or university this school year, and who do not wish to have their data shared must notify their guidance counsellor by Thursday October 5, 2023.

Semester 1 midterm marks will be shared with OCAS and OUAC on November 17, 2023. Students in Grade 11 and 12 courses will be notified of their report card mark by their classroom teacher by November 13, 2023. Potential graduates who are applying to an Ontario college and/or university who are planning to drop a course are encouraged to connect with their guidance counsellor in advance of these dates. Guidance appointments can be booked through TeachAssist.

Please review the timelines below:

October 5 Deadline for potential graduates who are not planning on applying to an Ontario college or university to notify their Guidance Counsellor if they do not want data shared with OCAS/OUAC this school year.

October 10-13 Students will receive a secure communication in their GAPPS email which provides information needed for their applications, including their OEN (required for college applications only), school MIDENT# (BSID)

November 13 Teachers will share mid semester mark updates with students in Grade 11 and 12 courses.

November 13 Potential graduates applying to an Ontario college or university that are planning to drop a course, and do not wish to have the course mark shared with OUAC/OCAS are advised to connect with their Guidance Counsellor by November 17.

November 17 School will upload all Semester 1 midterm and/or final marks (for quadmester courses) for all grade 11 and 12 courses to OUAC and OCAS

November 29 This is the full disclosure date which is the final day that a student, in a Grade 11 or 12 course, may drop a course in order that it not be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript.

We recognize that you and your child may have questions regarding this information. If it is helpful for you to connect with a staff member from the school, please contact the Guidance Department to discuss your questions.
