Grade 12 Students Signing Out During the School Day

Grade 12 is an exciting time, and an important part of your child's school experience. In order to support families and students and reiterate the importance of instructional school time for completion of credits, we wanted to take this opportunity to clarify some important information about the process to sign your child out. As per the Safe Arrival and Departure school policy, students shall:

- inform their parents/guardians of attendance at any after-school program or event; and
- inform their parents/guardians of any change to their regular departure plan; before they can sign out of school for the day.
- if their bus is canceled and the student attends school, report their attendance to the Main Office.
- As per the Ministry of Education, students need to complete 110 hours of in-class study, and complete all of their assignment/assessments to successfully achieve their credits

If students are 18 years or older or have declared independence they must:

- report all absences and lateness to the Main Office
- Students with a pattern of absences will need to provide a reason and speak with their Alpha VP

Student Use of Personal Mobile Devices

As you may know, in 2024, the Ontario Ministry of Education introduced a directive modifying the use of personal mobile devices in classrooms. YRDSB already has <u>Policy and Procedure 194.0</u> -<u>Appropriate Use of Technology</u> and many measures around personal mobile devices in place. The changes you may see in September will bring alignment with the new Ministry Directive. The following expectations for students' use of personal mobile devices are outlined in the revised <u>Provincial Code of Conduct (PPM 128)</u>, and the York Region District School Board's Policy #668 Caring and Safe Schools.

A personal mobile device is any personal electronic device that can be used to communicate or access the internet, such as a laptop, cellphone, tablet or smart watch.

Expectations

Students are responsible for their personal mobile device, how they use it and the consequences of not following the provincial or school board policy.

Students' personal mobile devices must be powered off or set to silent mode, except under the circumstances outlined below:

- o for educational purposes, as directed by an educator
- for health and medical purposes
- to support special education needs

Students in secondary school can bring a personal mobile device to school, but will be able to

use it only during non-instructional time.

New Practices at School

If an educator sees a personal mobile device that is not turned off or set to silent mode, even after staff reminders, the student may be required to place their personal mobile device in a storage area in a location designated by the educator for the class or period.

Your child may face consequences if they use their personal mobile device inappropriately. Progressive discipline may apply and families may be notified.

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Student Engagement Fee

The student engagement fee is a voluntary fee that may be used for services such as orientation programs, leadership programs, student recognition events, student clubs and organizations, guest speakers, and other school events. Please consider supporting the school by paying this fee through School Cash Online.


Safety Week (SEptember 23-27) - Emergency Preparedness Drills

Throughout the semester we will be participating in Fire Drills, Lockdown Drills, Hold and Secure Drills and Bomb Threat Drills. Staff will share procedures that should be followed with students. These drills help students become familiar with the procedures should something happen at school. During our Lockdown drill on Tuesday, we have invited our YRP Youth Engagement Officers to join us so that we can work together to ensure the Drills are done efficiently and thoroughly.

School Safety

In the interest of safely dropping off and picking up your child and to help traffic move smoother, we ask parents not to drop their children off or stop in the wheelchair bus area. Cars stopping in the wheelchair bus area block traffic behind them causing it to be slower for everyone and our wheelchair buses are unable to drop off and/or pick-up our students in a timely manner. In addition, the lanes directly in front of the main entrance are emergency and bus lanes, please do not use these lanes to drop off or pick up your child.

If you drive your child to school, you know that it can be quite busy. You can avoid the morning rush by dropping your child off before 7:45 a.m., carpooling, or encouraging your child to walk or make use of public transit.



Dear Families,

As part of a partnership between YRDSB and Renewed Computer Technology (RCT), families with children enrolled in our Board have the opportunity to purchase quality refurbished computers at a reduced cost. Applicants must live in Ontario, have a student enrolled at YRDSB and either receive government assistance payments or qualify as a limited income earner under the limited income cut-off standards*.

This year, there are different packages available for purchase. Please reference the <u>online</u> <u>application page</u> for the current available package offerings. Please note that there are three options for delivery.

- 1. If you would like for the computer to be delivered directly to your home, there is a \$25 charge for laptops and a \$35 charge for desktops. Families who choose this delivery option will have their order shipped when it is ready, roughly 3 weeks from date of order.
- If you would like the device shipped to your child's school there is a \$20 delivery charge. If you choose this shipping option, the computer will be delivered to your child's school after the end of the promotion period. Please indicate the name of the school on the form when selecting this option.
- 3. You may choose to pick up the computer from the RCT Mississauga Warehouse, for free, located at **945 Meyerside Drive, Mississauga**. Families who choose this option will have their order ready for pick up roughly 3 weeks after the date of order.



Parents and legal guardians may apply for one computer per student, with a limit of two per household. Please see below for a full list of device specifications.

If you are interested in applying, please complete an online application at <u>https://www.jotform.com/210054491659255</u> using the group code on the attached program flyer. The application period is from September 12, 2024 – November 22, 2024 with delivery to schools taking place in December.
