Halloween Reminders

Hallowe'en may bring memories of dress-up parades, costume competitions, and classroom parties for some members of our community and carries a very different meaning for others. It is important for us to recognize that not all families celebrate and participate in Halloween. The reasons for not participating may include cultural beliefs, faith, socioeconomic status, and personal reasons.

The expectation is that costumes follow our board and school's dress code and are to be respectful of others. Symbols or objects representative of a person's race, culture, ethnicity, or religious beliefs, should not be worn as another person's costume, nor should costumes that caricature social identities through stereotyping.

Reviewing our practices through a critically conscious lens doesn't devalue our personal beliefs or past traditions. Interrogating how things "have always been done" is one of the ways we work to continue our commitment to inclusion.

Should your child wish to wear a costume to school, please discuss the following guidelines:

- No costumes that violate conditions of the ECSS appropriate attire policy
- No Halloween masks are to be worn, we need to see faces to know who
 is in the school building
- No Weapons and/or replica weapons should not be carried as accessories. Costumes also should not simulate a weapon or promote extreme acts of violence.
- No Costumes insulting to a particular ethnicity, religion or gender.
- No Costumes that promote the use of drugs or alcohol
- limit personal items being brought to school, costumes should be of simple design.

Also, if your child would like to participate, but not wear a costume; wearing orange and black or autumn colours is an option.

Please Remember:

This is still a school day. Students are advised to bring a change of clothing, in case their costume is deemed inappropriate by teachers or administrators or become distracting to the learning process. We are looking forward to everyone following the guidelines, coming up with creative costumes, and having fun!

Dear Secondary School Families,

This letter is to inform you that there have been updates to student use of personal mobile devices in schools, in particular, students must now **store their mobile device out of view**, and power off or set to silent mode during instructional/class time. As you may know, in 2024, the Ontario Ministry of Education introduced a directive modifying the use of personal mobile devices in classrooms. YRDSB already has Policy and Procedure 194.0 - Appropriate Use of Technology and many measures around personal mobile devices in place. The changes you may see will bring alignment with the new Ministry Directive. The following expectations for students' use of personal mobile devices are outlined in the revised Provincial Code of Conduct (PPM 128), and the York Region District School Board's Policy #668 Caring and Safe Schools.

A personal mobile device is any personal electronic device that can be used to communicate or access the internet, such as a laptop, cellphone, tablet or smart watch.

Expectations

Students are responsible for their personal mobile device, how they use it and the consequences of not following the provincial or school board policy.

Students' personal mobile devices must be **stored out of view and powered off or set to silent mode**, except under the circumstances outlined below:

- o for educational purposes, as directed by an educator
- o for health and medical purposes
- to support special education needs

Students in secondary school can bring a personal mobile device to school, but will be able to use it only during non-instructional time.

New Practices at School

If an educator sees a personal mobile device that is not **stored out of view and powered off or set to silent mode**, even after staff reminders, the student may be required to place their personal mobile device in a storage area in a location designated by the educator for the class or period.

Your child may face consequences if they use their personal mobile device inappropriately. Progressive discipline may apply and families may be notified.


