2025-2026 TIMETABLES: Counsellors are currently working on timetables for next school year. Marks will be sent again at the beginning of August after the completion of summer school.

In order to receive the PAQ2O1 credit, students must demonstrate the expectations in the Ontario Curriculum which go beyond the Lifesaving Society's certifications.
