Student Technology (e.g. Cell Phone, Ipods) 2019-20 School Year

In consultation with School Council members at the October meeting the following school expectations were shared. The renewal of this policy is a direct result of the following: interruptions (texts, phone calls, emails) during instructional time; inappropriate use of technology during non-structured time (ie recess); and lost and damaged technology.

As per our *Acceptable Use of Personal Technology Policy* and *Caring and Safe Schools Policy* and; in keeping with provincial legislation; students may choose to bring their personal technology to school with them. Student access to our network, and use of personal technology at school is subject to the following:

School Use of Personal Technology Expectations

- 1. Student personal technology is not to be brought into the classroom during instructional periods unless under the direction of a staff member and for specific learning objectives.
- 2. Students who bring personal technology to school *must* store their technology in their locker or backpack during instructional periods.
- 3. In order to ensure student privacy is protected, student personal technology is not to be used during recess and lunch breaks unless under the direct supervision of a staff member for a specific purpose.

Enforcement Measures



Students who do not meet the expectations outlined can expect the following:

- Classroom progressive discipline responses (reminder, warning, parent contact)
- 2. Referral to administration for school discipline responses (parent contact)
- 3. Removal of school network access for a specified time frame.

Proactive and Supportive Measures

Students may access the following supportive measures to assist them in meeting these expectations and further develop their language and social skills:

- 1. Recess and lunch hour intra-mural activities, clubs and games;
- 2. Enhanced outdoor learning opportunities
- 3. Classroom instruction to support social skills development and increase understanding of appropriate use of social media and technology.

Attendance and Punctuality

Did you know that regular attendance and punctuality are a strong indicator of school success? Regular attendance and punctuality are a vital part of learning and are directly linked to student success. Students who attend school regularly have better grades and are more engaged with school. You can support your child by ensuring they are at school everyday and on time for class. School begins at 8:20 a.m. Please ensure your children are on time every day.

Lunch Schedule

Students who require supervision during the lunch hour (12:10-1:10) are welcome to stay at the school. Students in Gr. 5-8 will be eating from 12:10-12:40 while students in Kindergarten to Gr. 4 will play outside. From 12:40 -1:10, students in Kindergarten to Gr. 4 will be eating and Gr. 5-8 will be outside to play. All students will eat in their classrooms and will be supervised by School Assistants. In some cases senior students will assist the School Assistants with classroom supervision.

Students who stay for lunch must follow the expectations listed below:

- a) eat their lunch sitting down in their seats
- b) ask the school assistants or class supervisor to leave the room when they need to use the washroom
- c) clean up their own garbage
- d) leave the classroom to go outside when the bell rings
- e) during an indoor recess, due to bad weather, play quietly

Students who are not able to cooperate at lunch will have one or all of the following consequences:

- a) eat lunch in the office
- b) call or note home
- c) have the privilege of eating at school removed

School Assistants at Fairwood Public School Needed

Thank you to our current lunch assistants. We depend on you to keep our lunch hours safe and enjoyable for our students. We need to hire six (6) permanent School Assistants at Fairwood for the fall.



We understand the challenge of individuals wishing to commit to a position for one hour in the middle of the day, however, in order to safely supervise our students at lunch, we require six (6) full time school assistants. If we are unable to find the appropriate number of school assistants, we will need to adjust where the children eat (for example in the gym instead of in their classroom).

- 6. Proceed with ordering your child's lunch by clicking on the blue box for each restaurant featured.
- 7. All orders are submitted on the website and payment is processed on-line by Visa, MasterCard, Discover, Debit MasterCard or Visa Debit. Visa and MasterCard prepaid cards are also accepted.
