<u>under review</u> and available for comment as well as information about how to share your feedback. I hope you will take a look.







#### Student Allergies: Shellfish & Peanut and Nut Aware

In our school, there are students and staff with potentially life-threatening forms of allergic reactions called Anaphylaxis. If by accident, the allergic child is to come into contact with even a small quantity of **peanut or nut products**, **shellfish**, their residues, or even the scent of nuts, the child may develop hives, swelling and demonstrate difficulty in breathing. If the reaction is not stopped, the symptoms may become more severe leading to a drop in blood pressure, unconsciousness and or death. Immediate action must be taken by use of adrenaline injection (Epi-pen). All affected individuals in our school with this condition carry an Epi-pen at all times and staff are trained in their use and administration.

#### **Electronic Devices**

Please do not send your child to school with iPads, iPods, cell phones etc. The school will not assume responsibility for these valuable items. Other items that should not be used at school include skateboards, roller blades, heelies, scooters or laser pointers.



#### **Keeping Our Schools Safe and Orderly**

In accordance with the principal's responsibilities under the Education Act, to ensure a sale and orderly learning environment, the school has the right to search school property, such as lockers and desks, without notice to, or permission of any person.

From time to time, the police may be invited onto school property to conduct their own searches and these searches may be conducted without notice or permission of any member of the school community as per our Joint Board and Police Protocol. When conducting a search of school property, persons or personal property, the police are responsible for conforming to all legal requirements with respect to searches.

It is important to us that we provide a caring, safe and inclusive environment in our school that supports the academic achievement and well-being of all students. We held a school assembly this week to talk about some of the important elements of a caring and safe school. You may want to have a conversation with your child about what they learned and discussed. Topics covered include:

#### **Positive Behaviour**

Students are encouraged to demonstrate positive character attributes (such as empathy, courage and respect for human rights and inclusivity). We also discussed standing up for each other in bullying situations and the importance of reporting incidents of bullying, including:

- o Telling a caring adult
- Using the YRDSB's "Report It Button" (located on our school website)
- o Contacting Kids Help Phone (1-800-668-6868)

#### **Student Discipline**

We use a progressive discipline approach when inappropriate behaviour occurs. This means we consider a range of options to determine the most appropriate response to each situation to help students learn from their choices. In some cases, suspension or expulsion may be necessary. The Ontario Education Act and our Board Caring and Safe Schools Policy outline the situations in which suspension and expulsion must be considered. These infractions are also outlined in the Guide to the School Year. When inappropriate behaviour occurs, information will be shared with the victim and parents/guardians of the victim to the extent that legislation allows.

#### Tobacco/Alcohol/Drug-Free Environment

The use of tobacco, electronic products (such as vaping, electronic cigarettes and cigars and related products) and/or student possession of alcohol/illegal and restricted drugs, including cannabis, are prohibited on school property or within 20 metres of school boundaries. This also applies during Board or school-sponsored events and activities. This is in compliance with the Smoke-Free Ontario Act, which is enforced locally by York Region Community and Health Services and the Tobacco and Smoke-Free Environment Policy and Procedure. A progressive form of discipline, including suspension from school and fines (up to \$5,000), is in place for students who break the law. In accordance with the Smoke-Free Ontario Act (SFOA), exceptions are made for the traditional use of tobacco that forms part of Indigenous culture and spirituality.

We also discussed the potential harms associated with vaping and e-cigarettes, including that e-cigarettes can contain nicotine, formaldehyde and other harmful chemicals, and are being used to inhale other harmful substances such as marijuana, weight loss supplements and other drugs. Partnership for Drug Free Kids also provides a resource on how to talk to your kids about vaping.

#### **Appropriate Use of Technology**

Students were reminded about the Appropriate Use of Technology agreement, including the importance of using respectful language and making positive choices when using electronic communications and social media tools.

Students were reminded that threats made online are taken seriously and may have serious consequences, including potential criminal charges. Where there are concerns for the safety of students, staff, community members or Board property, the school board works closely with York Regional Police and appropriate actions are taken. The safety and well-being of students remains our top priority.

### Threat Assessment and Intervention

The well-being and safety of members of the school community are a shared responsibility. Attention to maintaining secure environments, hazard awareness, and practical planning for emergencies is important for all of us. This includes preventing and responding to the risk of violence.

Schools continue to be among the safest places in our community. To continue to promote the safety and well-being of students, we have developed, with our community partners, Student Threat Assessment and Intervention procedures to respond to threats of violence.

Our Student Threat Assessment and Intervention Protocol has been developed to respond to behaviours, including actions, statements and other indicators that suggest that a student may be "at risk" of harming others. To keep school communities safe and provide support to everyone, staff, parents, students, and community members must report all threat-related behaviours to the school administrator or police as soon as possible.

Note - other procedures and protocols are in place to deal with threats from adults in the school community.

#### Student Threat Assessment and Intervention: Fair Notice and Process

# What is the purpose of Student Threat Assessment and Intervention procedures?

The purposes of Student Threat Assessment and Intervention procedures are intended to:

- ensure the safety of students, staff, parents and other members of the school community;
- ensure an effective and timely response when there is a threat of violence;
- begin to understand the factors that contribute to a situation where an individual makes threats to harm others;
- assist in the development of an intervention plan; and
- promote the emotional and physical safety of everyone involved.

#### What is a threat?

A threat is an indication of intent to do harm or act out violently against someone or something. Threats may be verbal, written, drawn, posted on the Internet, made by gesture or reasonably inferred from the surrounding circumstances of events. Threats must be taken seriously, investigated and responded to in a timely way.

### What happens when a threat of violence is reported?

All threatening behaviours by a student shall be reported to the principal who will activate the Student Threat Assessment and Intervention protocol.

Once a threat has been reported to a school administrator, interviews will be conducted. These interviews may include students, staff, family members and/or others as appropriate. This will be done to determine the level of risk, and develop an effective and timely response to the incident. After the immediate safety risk has been addressed, support and intervention plans will be developed with input from parents/guardians.

### Is parental/student consent required?

Consent is not required to respond to an emergency situation. When there is a risk that someone may be harmed, it is important that the incident be addressed as quickly and effectively as possible with all parties involved as necessary.

#### **Fair Notice**

Please consider this pamphlet as "fair notice" to all members of the school community that any report of a threat to harm others (spoken, written or gestured) will be investigated. The Student Threat Assessment Intervention protocol is part of our strategy to create a safe, secure and supportive school environment for everyone.

## Who is a member of a Student Threat Assessment and Intervention team?

Each school will have staff trained in the Student Threat Assessment and Intervention process. A multi-disciplinary Student Threat Assessment and Intervention team will carry-out the threat assessment, and develop an effective and timely intervention plan. The team includes a School Administrator, a School Social Worker and/or a Psychological Services staff member, or a York Regional Police officer and/or school personnel who know the student well.
