- develop proportional reasoning; and
- build confidence in one's math ability.

Please see below for the basic Number Sense and Numeration expectations by grade from the Ontario Curriculum. Please know that these are **END OF YEAR** expectations which will be reported on in June.

Math Basics ~ Number Sense

- Gr. 1 adding and subtracting numbers to 20
- Gr. 2 adding and subtracting two-digit numbers with and without regrouping
- Gr. 3 adding and subtracting three digit-numbers; one-digit multiplication (up to 7x7) and division (up to 49/7)
- Gr. 4 adding and subtracting four-digit numbers; adding & subtracting decimals to tenths; one-digit multiplication (up to 9x9) and division (up to 81/9); multiply and divide two-digit numbers by one-digit numbers
- Gr. 5 multiply two-digit numbers by two-digit numbers; divide three-digit numbers by one-digit numbers; multiply decimal numbers by 10, 100, 1000 & 10,000; divide decimal numbers by 10 & 100
- Gr. 6 multiply and divide four-digit numbers by two-digit numbers; add & subtract decimal numbers to thousandths; multiply and divide decimal numbers to tenths; relationships between fractions, decimals, percents and ratios
- Gr. 7 divide whole numbers by fractions and decimal numbers to hundredths; multiply and divide decimal numbers to thousandths by one-digit whole numbers; use order of operations; add and subtract fractions with like and unlike denominators; add and subtract integers; relationships between fractions, decimals, percents and ratios
- Gr. 8 add, subtract, multiply & divide fractions, operations with integers; exponents; multiply and divide decimal numbers by various powers of 10; square roots
