A New School Year

The start of a new school year is a time of transition - whether your child is starting elementary or secondary school for the first time, entering a new program, moving to a new school or beginning a new grade. The caring, dedicated and professional staff members who work in our system are here to help support your child through this transition. Please feel free to reach out to your child's teachers or the school to speak about your child's transition and the supports that are available.

We also recognize that transitions can take place throughout September. Elementary schools may be required to adjust some classes due to enrollment changes and class size restrictions. In secondary school, schools may also see timetable requests and adjustments in the first few weeks. These are occurrences that happen each fall and schools do their best to be responsive and to minimize the effects of any changes on students.

Partnerships with Families

We value the essential partnership between schools and families and want to ensure that families are aware of the many resources available. Our <u>family resources page</u>, available from the homepage of <u>www.yrdsb.ca</u>, gives you quick access to platforms that we use, tips and information, the <u>Guide to the School Year</u> and <u>student learning resources</u>. It also includes resources for <u>newcomers</u>, <u>translation information</u> and much more. 
What to Bring to School



Students should bring:

- 1) Backpack easy to open (please do not hang any toys or hand sanitizer on the backpack)
- 2) Snack and Lunch in easy-to-open containers -reminder no food drop-offs will be permitted. Change of clothes (for younger students, in-door shoes, clearly labelled that can be left at school. Recommended to put in a large resealable bag with your child's name on it).
- 3) Refillable water bottle (clearly labelled with your child's name on it)

NOTE: If any families have any questions about what to bring to school, please contact your child's Homeroom teacher.



Late for School

If you are late for school, use the office doors (late only). Buzz the office and someone will let you know so you can sign your child in. A staff member will walk your child to their class. We are asking all parents to wait outside the office with their young child until someone is able to come and pick them up. For safety reasons, a staff member will walk the younger students to the appropriate class. Older students can walk themselves to their class after signing in at the office.



If you need to pick your child up early, please call ahead so that we can have your child ready for you. When you arrive, ring the doorbell and we will send your child out. Thanks for your ongoing understanding and patience.







If your child has developed an allergy or medical condition, please inform the office immediately. To all families, please return your medical information to the office as soon as possible.

What Ontario-grown products are sold?


- Vegetable Bundle contains: 5 lb potatoes, 3 lb carrots, 3 lb onions, 3 lb sweet potatoes \rightarrow \$22
- Apple Bundle contains: 8 lb Ambrosia apples →\$24
- Additionally, Fossil is selling a **recipe book** specific to these vegetables and apples for **\$4**.

What profit does the school make?

- 40% of total sales
- A school selling an average of 150 Vegetable Bundle and 60 Apple Bundle makes a profit of \$1560

Student Safety

while riding YRT

York Region Transit (YRT) cares about your safety and security. The dedicated YRT Transit Enforcement and Security team offers security, customer assistance and fare enforcement services throughout the system.



Practice the following safety tips when taking transit

- Take extra care when walking or cycling to or from your bus stop
- Always cross at a designated crosswalks or intersections; only cross when the designated light/walk signal is displayed
- Make eye contact with motorists when crossing the street
- Be aware of your surroundings at the bus stop and on the bus Board at the front doors, exit at the rear doors
- > Keep an eye on your belongings
- Be alert and listen; heads up, phones down!
- Know where you are getting on/off the bus



Transit safety is everyone's responsibility; see something, say something

- Report any verbal, physical, sexual harassment or discrimination by alerting the driver, an enforcement officer or any YRT uniformed staff
- Report issues by calling the YRT Contact Centre at 1-866-668-3978 or Live Chat with a Customer Service Representative
- If there is a true emergency call 9-1-1 immediately and notify the driver or any other YRT personnel when safe to do so

- Travelling at Night Request-Stop Program




