LOSING A LOVED ONE DURING COVID 19- This 8 session group is for individuals who have lost a loved one during and/or because of COVID 19. This group will provide participants an opportunity to explore their grief in a safe and supportive environment; give participants educational material and strategies to normalize their grief and help them move forward in their process; explore the uniqueness of the death experience during COVID 19; help participants expand their repertoire of coping skills for mourning. Thursdays June 3/21 from 12 to 1:30 p.m.

<u>Mastering Your Separation-</u> Join us for a one session workshop to learn how you can be the master of your own separation. Topics include: understanding separation concerns; discovering your own emotional triggers; creating self-worth and self-awareness during the separation process; learning strategies for maintaining emotional control; differentiating between the legal separation and the emotional separation; becoming a better you and creating your own mindfulness tool box. **Sunday June 13/21 from 9:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.**

<u>HIGH CONFLICT DIVORCE</u>- A workshop for parents wanting to develop strategies and techniques to deal with a High Conflict situation and help to lessen the impact of that conflict on their children. This workshop is not for individuals in an abusive situation. **Tuesday June** 29/21 from 7 to 9 p.m.



<u>JEWISH HERITAGE MONTH – MAY 2021</u>

<u>Canadian Jewish Heritage Month</u> was given Royal Assent in the Senate of Canada on March 29, 2018. As we approach the month of May, staff and students are encouraged to engage in opportunities that celebrate and affirm Jewish histories and the achievements of the Jewish community.

Canada is home to the fourth largest Jewish population in the world. There are close to 400,000 Jewish residents in Canada, and almost half of that number reside in Ontario. Jewish settlers in Canada can be traced as far back as 1760. Jewish Canadians have proudly contributed to Canadian heritage in all of its facets including the military, the arts, government, business, academia, law, medicine, culture, and sports. Throughout the month of May, we celebrate the contributions Jewish Canadians make in communities across the country.

ASIAN AND SOUTH ASIAN HERITAGE MONTH – MAY 2021

May is Asian and South Asian Heritage Month in Ontario. In May 2002, the Government of Canada officially declared May as Asian Heritage Month. At the provincial level, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario designated May as South Asian Heritage Month in 2001 and as Asian Heritage Month in 2005.

<u>The South Asian Heritage Act of 2001</u> established the foundation upon which South Asians, whose origins are or can be traced to the Indian subcontinent, can see themselves reflected and valued in the fabric of Ontario and our schools, and appreciated for their extensive contributions to Canada.

In <u>May 2002, the Government of Canada</u> signed an official declaration to designate May as Asian Heritage Month. This acknowledges the long and rich history of Asian Canadians from East Asia, Southern Asia, Western and Southeast Asia and their contributions to significant Canada
