YRDSB APP

Did you know that you can download the York Region District School Board app, *YRDSB Mobile*, using your iPhone, Android or Blackberry 10 device? *YRDSB Mobile* provides parents and students with up -to-date news, access to student resources, school maps and contact information. Users are able to access the *Report It* tool, school year calendars, transportation information and much more.

To download the free app, search for "YRDSB" in your app store.

Letter Requests

At various times throughout the school year, the government of Canada may require attendance verification letters from our school to verify student enrollment. These letters are time consuming as we need to verify and print attendance data from previous years.

If you receive such a request, you need to bring in the request letter to Ms. Whitfield. Ms. Whitfield will process your request within a week's time. As the office is a very busy place, We DO NOT create the letter the same day as it is a time consuming process.

MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

Any medication that a child requires, e.g. inhalers, epi-pens, Benedryl, Tylenol, Advil, etc., must be stored in the school office.

The Staff Administration of Medication form must be completed for all students with epipens and/or medication that will be administered by staff, e.g. antibiotics. A Self-Administration of Medication



form should be completed for all students with inhalers or other medications that are self administered, e.g. Tylenol, Advil, etc. Please contact the office if you require a copy of these forms.

Anaphylaxis Safety

This is a reminder that Nuts and Nut Products are not to be sent to school with your child.

Also, please avoid the use of substitute peanut butter products such as Wow Butter. These products tend to look, taste, and smell very much like peanut butter. While the product is nut free, it mimics a known allergen that causes anaphylaxis in some children to the degree that it is indistinguishable from the allergen. It is a convincing substitute, opening up the possibility that it can be confused as peanut butter, or worse yet, peanut butter could be confused as this soy-based product.

The same applies to Nutella and other cocoa spread products. We thank you for your cooperation to ensure our students are safe.

NO CHILD WITHOUT

The **No Child Without** program offers a free MedicAlert membership to students who attend our school and are between the ages of 4 up to their 14th birthday. If your chid has a medical condition, allergy, or is required to take medications on a regular basis then you should consider a MedicAlert membership through this program.

Your child's voice in an emergency, MedicAlert membership:

- Gives emergency first responders immediate access to your child's medical information on their MedicAlert bracelet or necklet
- Enables first responders to quickly obtain the up to date medical information by means of the child's Electronic Health Record through the 24 Hour Emergency Hotline.
- Communicates with the parent or emergency contact upon activation of the Hotline
- Allows free updates of the child's medical record as needed.

VOLUNTEERING AT SCHOOL

Please note that ALL parents wishing to volunteer in our school must obtain a Vulnerable Sector Screening (VSS) check from York Region Police. This requirement is to protect your children at school. If you are thinking of joining a field trip, being a volunteer in the library, helping our school lunch assistants hand out pizza or helping in any other way that involves contact with students the VSS check must be carried out.

Once you have the Vulnerable Sector Screening check , please bring the original copy to the school office to be copied. It can be used for a period of three years.

Due to building capacity regulations, we request that only students and parents interested in attending BCSS for the school year 2016 - 2017, attend one of these evenings. Parking is limited so we ask that parents carpool or park at the GO Station. Markham By-law officers regularly enforce the parking regulations on school property, so please abide by the posted parking regulations.

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BUSSING

Students MUST ride the bus to which they have been assigned. They must also get on and off the bus at their assigned stop. Students will not be allowed to switch buses or to take friends home on the bus unless their parent/guardian sends a written request to the school for that particular day. If there is room on the bus, the office will sign the note and the driver may allow the student on their bus.



Please keep the Board website (www.schoolbuscity.com) and telephone hotline (1-866-287-7837) handy to check route updates for your child. Each year, your child's bus number and route may change

as students move in and out of the area. Once set for the year (usually by mid-September), the school will advise you of any changes to your child's route.

If your child's transportation to and from school is from a daycare or babysitter and the address is other than your home address, please notify the office. Our transportation information for your child is based on your home address, unless you specify otherwise. As a reminder, students attending German Mills on a transfer, are not entitled to bussing.

DROP OFF & PICK UP REMINDERS

At GMPS, safety is paramount. Please note that the traffic patterns and rules must be adhered to. Please <u>do not</u> leave your vehicles in the bus loop and please demonstrate respect to all.

- No parking along the curbs in our 'loop'
- Daycare parents may use the loop to park before 8:30 a.m., but not after
- Parking is available on Simonston Blvd. just east of the school sign, all the way to Granada Court
- Parking is available on the South Side (odd numbered side) of Thurgate, Bucks Green, Six-penny and Cobblestone
- Our bus loop is shared with the busses for St. Michaels so it is imperative that we follow the rules for the safety of our own children as well as for our neighbours.

ATTENDANCE & SAFE ARRIVAL

If your child is absent:

Parents/guardians must telephone the school at 905-889-8776 before 8:30 a.m. to leave a message with your child's name, teacher, and the reason for the absence. Please speak clearly and spell your child's name when leaving a message.

Students must sign in and out of the school using the binder in the school office. IF YOUR CHILD IS NOT AT SCHOOL AND IS NOT ACCOUNTED FOR BY A NOTE OR TELEPHONE CALL, THE SCHOOL WILL:

1) Call home to check (and if not accounted for)

2) Call the parents at work (and if the child is still not accounted for)

- 3) Call the emergency numbers (and if the child is still not accounted for)
- 4) We will then telephone the York Regional Police, as per our safe arrival policy.

Please Note that our school voice mail service is available outside of our regular office hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
